Making Each Day Holy

In the middle of Lent, I think of many things in our life - growth, new resolutions, suffering, change, new life, hope, sacrifice, renewal, re-commitment - to mention a few.

This is an interesting and challenging time. We have our Pope and Bishop going through health difficulties. This shows us the weakness of all humans and the equality of all, as God does not have favorites, allowing various things to happen in all people's lives.

We see also their example of accepting suffering, disability and weakness. We learn that victory goes not to the "strong, the healthy, and the beautiful," but that God works in the lowly, the meek, the sick and the poor.

In the small things of life - the ordinary events of our days, the little sacrifices imposed or chosen, the acceptance of our situations, be it sickness, old age, loss of abilities such as sight or hearing - we can make each day holy. Indeed, the circumstances and happenings of our lives are not as important as seeing things from God's perspective so that we realize God has a plan, a love and a sacred space for each of us. We can rejoice even in loss, pain and the difficulties of life, accept the cross and walk with Jesus in every circumstance on our way to eternal life.

May God bless you this Holy Season and lead each of us through a life of Lenten sacrifice and growth to the joy of the Resurrection at Easter.

HOLY HOUR: On Tuesday, March 8, 2005, at 7:00 pm in the church, Holy Family Parish will celebrate a Holy Hour including the RCIA Rite of the Presentation of the Creed.

The concept of a Holy "Hour" was inspired by Christ's words to His apostles in Gethsemane, "Can you not watch one hour with me?" A Holy Hour consists of the Exposition of the Eucharist, Adoration, Benediction and Reposition. This "sacramental ritual" is rooted in the Passion of Christ - in the Eucharist - and its celebration leads us to focus on the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and to keep the Eucharist where it belongs, at the center of our lives.

The Presentation of the Creed is a ritual designed for the elect to summarize their catechetical formation and prepare them for Christian prayer. It is an important step for the community to hand on our faith to those who will be presenting themselves for initiation. The actual "presentation" takes place orally - the faithful proclaim the Creed. We are all part of the RCIA process, and all parishioners are encouraged to participate in this ritual sharing of the faith.

Any opportunity for adoration of the Eucharist is a blessing - please join your parish family for this special celebration.

CHRISM MASS 2005: The Annual Chrism Mass for the Diocese of Sacramento will be held Thursday, March 17, at 6:30 pm at Our Lady of the Assumption Church, Carmichael. You are invited to join Bishop Weigand, Bishop Garcia, the clergy, religious and gathered faithful of the Diocese for this important liturgical celebration.

The Chrism Mass is the Mass at which the holy oils used for sacramental anointing are blessed. There are three oils blessed at the Chrism Mass: the Oil of Catechumens, the first oil used in Baptism; the Oil of the Sick, used in Anointing of the Sick; and, the Holy Chrism, used in the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, in the ordination of a priest or bishop and the dedication of a church building or altar. The oils blessed at this Chrism Mass will be distributed to all parishes and missions in the Diocese for use throughout the year.

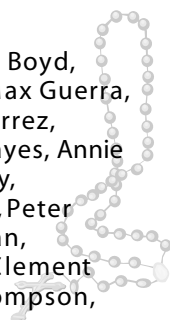

SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES:

A special collection for Catholic Relief Services will be taken next weekend, March 12/13. This is the new name for the Bishops' Overseas Appeal, which helps build the Church's international social ministry by funding five agencies: Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Migration and Refugee Services, Social Development and World Peace, and the Holy Father Relief Fund. Catholic Relief Services received national acclaim recently as one of the agencies to support during the tsunami crisis. A portion of this special collection will be allocated for the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe.

DIOCESAN FOOD BOWL: The goal of the Food Bowl is to encourage every parish to do something during Lent in response to the needs of the less fortunate. The familiar bowl, dressed in purple, has taken up its traditional place in the sanctuary - an appropriate place as the mission of the Food Bowl is at the core of the Gospel. The idea of the program is to take money saved from taking smaller, meager meals during Lent and set it aside for others in need. The savings are deposited in the Food Bowl, then collected and distributed to groups that request a grant. Last year more than 27 groups were supported throughout the Diocese.
