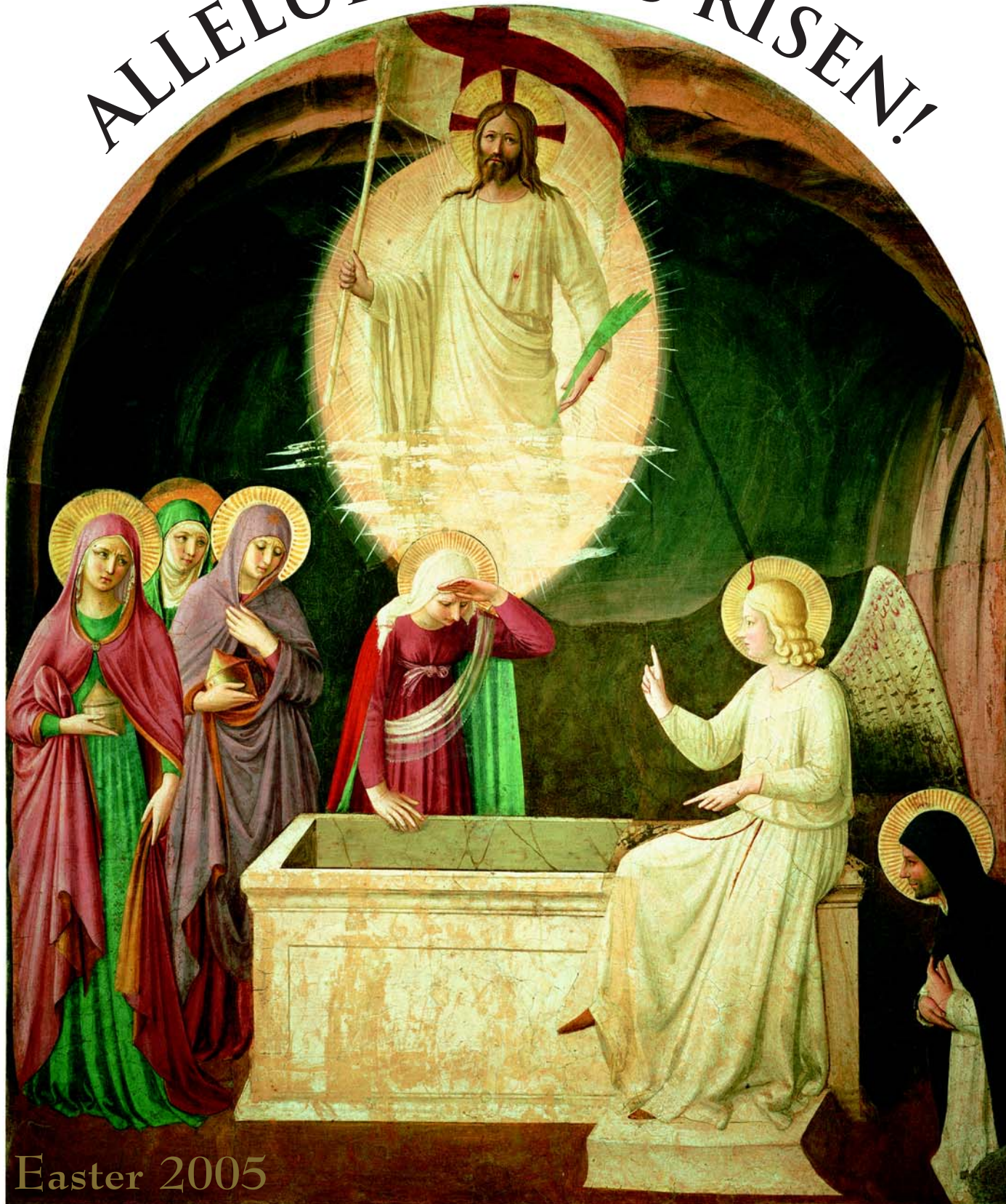

# March 27, 2005 – Easter Sunday: The Resurrection of the Lord

### **ALLELUIA! CHRIST IS RISEN!**

*This week we have celebrated the heart of the church year, all culminating today in the joyous Resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday. I would like to extend my warmest Easter greetings to those of you who celebrate the Eucharist with us throughout the year and a special welcome to those of you who are visiting or have been away from the church, for whatever reason, who have come to celebrate this truly awesome event with us. In the short time I have been at Holy Family, I have found the people of this faith community to be a wonderful reflection of Christ in their generosity, in their hospitality and compassion, and I'm sure those of you who are visiting or coming home to Holy Family will experience that same love and warmth.*

*Easter Sunday falls on a different date each year, but this year it is so close to the first day of spring that it is fitting to note the similarity of the resurrection to spring - it's all about new life! In just three days, we have journeyed from the suffering and death of Jesus on Good Friday to the glorious, joyful celebration of His Resurrection. Eternal life is offered by Jesus on this day of his rising, conquering sin and death.*

*The women of Holy Family can take special inspiration from the powerful and critical role of women in the history of the Resurrection. The women of Jerusalem faithfully followed Jesus through his passion and death, and were the first to experience the awe and excitement of the empty tomb. Mary Magdalene became, as Pope John Paul II wrote, "apostle to the apostles" as she was the first to share the news of Christ's rising.*

*We find great encouragement in Christ's journey from suffering to resurrection - a will to keep strong regardless of the ups and downs that life throws our way. We are an "Alleluia People" as the great acclamation is brought back to us on Easter Sunday after having been silenced during the Lenten journey. "Alleluia! Alleluia! Hearts to heaven and voices raise. Sing to God a hymn of gladness; sing to God a hymn of praise. He who on the cross as Savior for the world's salvation bled. Jesus Christ, the King of Glory now is risen from the dead."*

Pope John Paul II decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter be designated as Divine Mercy Sunday to pay special recognition to how "merciful and gracious is the Lord (Ps 111:4), who out of the great love with which he loved us (Eph 2:4) and with unspeakable goodness, gave us his Only-begotten Son as our Redeemer, so that through the Death and Resurrection of this Son he might open the way to eternal life." Holy Family will celebrate the occasion with the regular weekend mass schedule.

Thursday, March 31st marks the new beginning of the Catholics Returning Home program at Holy Family Parish.

*What man among you, if he has a hundred sheep and has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open pasture and go after the one which is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!"*

*I tell you that in the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. Luke 15:4-7*

If you or someone you know has been away from the Church for whatever reason, we invite you to consider attending this special series called CATHOLICS RETURNING HOME. This ministry is designed to reach out and invite non-participating and inactive Catholics to return "Home to the Catholic Church" and resume active practice of their faith.

## **"MANGIAMO ITALIANO!" – "LET'S EAT ITALIAN!"**

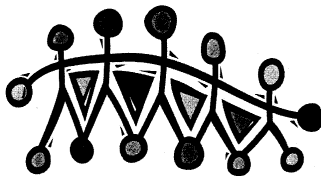

# TRAVELING THE ROAD TO EMMAUS - LIVING THE RESURRECTION

The Lord has truly been raised! Taken from the alternate Gospel reading for Easter Sunday, this profound exultation by the two disciples returning from Emmaus is the very heart of the Good News of Easter. It is a message delivered with tremendous joy and awe.

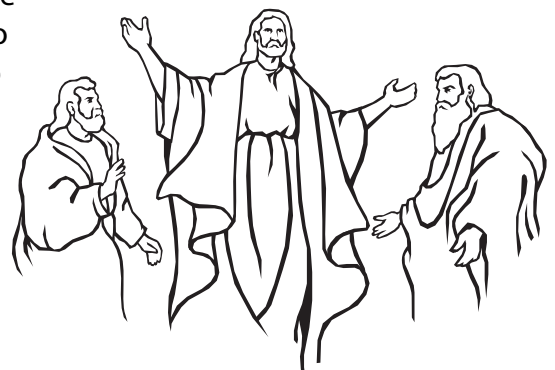
Today, we take up the mission of exclaiming that joyous news. The two disciples that met up with Jesus on the road to Emmaus weren't simply delivering the day's news, but announcing to all the world that life had been changed forever! They proclaimed the news not just to inform, but to inspire, to convince and to convert the hearts of all people. The message was Resurrection - the message was Life. And, in their news was an underlying message of faith. It is not enough to know of the resurrection passively - our faith requires believing and living that resurrection every day of our lives.

It would be impossible to forget the difficulties and suffering of every day life. From tsunamis to crippling poverty to the death and devastation of war and the untimely loss of youthful life, we don't need any convincing of the existence of hardships and pain in this world. Faith in resurrected life does not take away the suffering, but gives it meaning and gives us eternal hope. We are called to bring the news of Christ's rising to the world in the face of our suffering and pain, like the disciples of Jesus who, bolstered by the hope of the resurrection, went so far as to sacrifice their lives to bring the good news to the world.

Life in 2005, at first glance, seems to conflict openly with the news of resurrection - people of all ages, all walks of life, all races and ethnicity suffer oppression and attacks on their human dignity on far too regular a basis. The darker side of human nature seems to be the focus of our entertainment, our politics and certainly our news. Selfishness and sin are not only tolerated, but promoted and virtually exalted everywhere we turn. All of this is happening in spite of the continued growth of the universal church - the ever expanding body of those who believe in the life of resurrection and the Glory of God. It is our baptismal charge to bring the Good News of the resurrection to this world at a time of its greatest need. While giving in to the darkness of sin and the godlessness of our times is the "easy way" and even celebrated, we need to hold fast to believing and affirming the truth of the resurrection every day, everywhere.

Easter is to be celebrated every day of our lives. We are blessed in the Catholic faith to have the Eucharist made available to us every day. The Resurrection of our Lord and the gift of His Spirit give us the strength and the will to bring Christ into our everyday circumstances and relationships. The Easter season gives us an opportunity to hear the Good News, share the Good News and live the Good news - to commit ourselves to the promise of our baptism and dedicate ourselves to recognizing, reaching for, and proclaiming resurrected life everywhere we go and in everything we do.

Every day we travel the road to Emmaus, and every day Christ walks with us, greets us, extends his peace and his love to us, and gives us news to share with the world around us. Faith is a gift and a choice - we must choose to live the resurrection, to keep Christ in our lives.
