CHRISTIAN UNITY THROUGH PRAYER

Next weekend, we will have a special guest speaker. With us will be Reverend A. Dwight Burchett, President of the National Association of Evangelicals, Northern California. Reverend Burchett is a personal friend of Bishop Weigand who has previously invited him to preach in the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

This is a time when Christian Unity has become a priority objective, not only in the Roman Catholic Church, but for all Christians. Much effort has been invested in working to remove the barriers which divide Christians. Outstanding success has been made in ecumenical dialogue over the last several years, and although significant advances continue to be made among Christian churches, there can be no lasting unity without prayer becoming the very heart and soul of ecumenical efforts. Prayer gives us the courage to carry on in the face of seemingly overwhelming obstacles. It is for this very reason that we have invited Reverend Burchett to join us in the celebration of the universal prayer of the church - the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

We hoped to have Reverend Burchett at Holy Family in January when the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is celebrated, but due to scheduling needs we had to postpone his visit - until now! Pastor Burchett is well known in the community and has pastored Valley Community Church for 37 years. We welcome him and his dear wife Dorothy who is also well known as a counselor in the community for many years.

It is Bishop Weigand's desire that Catholics in our diocese join the millions of Christians throughout the world in praying for unity among the Christian Churches as willed by Christ, and give thanks to God for all the good that has been done and for all the riches that will be had when Christian Churches are, at last, reconciled in harmony and prayer.

Pope John Paul reminds us that we all make up God's temple - sacred and full of dignity, and nobody has the right to destroy this temple. We are those with whom God wants to feel at home - a place where his good Spirit dwells. God wants to have fellowship with us, which includes and requires that we have fellowship with each other. Since this call to fellowship extends beyond the borders of our Christian communities, the indignity of our divisions as Christian churches is heightened, making it imperative to overcome them.

Come and experience this new step in our journey toward unity. The Burchetts will be with us next Saturday, April 9th, at the 4:30 pm Mass, and Sunday, April 10th, at the 9:00 am and 12 noon Masses.

HOLY FAMILY PRAYS FOR THE HOLY FATHER:

All Masses this weekend are offered for Pope John Paul II. In addition, the church will remain open from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm for the weekend to give parishioners an opportunity for prayer and reflection. Eucharistic Adoration will continue in the chapel on its regular schedule, as well.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY:

This Sunday, the church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. Pope John Paul II decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter be designated as Divine Mercy Sunday to pay special recognition to how "merciful and gracious is the Lord (Ps 111:4), who out of the great love with which he loved us (Eph 2:4) and with unspeakable goodness, gave us his Only-begotten Son as our Redeemer, so that through the Death and Resurrection of this Son he might open the way to eternal life." Holy Family will celebrate the occasion with the regular weekend mass schedule.

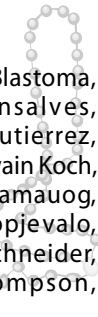

Thursday, March 31st marked the new beginning of the Catholics Returning Home program at Holy Family Parish.

What man among you, if he has a hundred sheep and has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open pasture and go after the one which is lost until he finds it? When he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, "Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!"

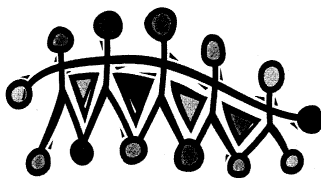

St. Patrick's Home for Children

Holy Family Parish has a special connection with St. Patrick's Home For Children since Fr. Kiernan was appointed Executive Director by Bishop Weigand earlier this year. Over the coming weeks, we will explore how best to nurture and develop that connection, and in the meantime it is important that we learn some of the basics about St. Patrick's.

MISSION STATEMENT

St. Patrick's mission is to place children who have been removed from their homes in a culturally similar supportive environment. Providing a stabilizing environment for children until appropriate permanency can be achieved.

HISTORY

St. Patrick's Home for Children was Founded in 1863. It moved to its present location on Franklin Boulevard in 1932. In over one hundred years of existence, the home has served the many needs of the children and families of Sacramento and the surrounding areas. St. Patrick's has evolved from an orphanage to a varied program offering residential treatment for emotional disturbed teenage females, childcare, foster family and adoption services.

St. Patrick's is dedicated to the idea that all children deserve the security, attention, and guidance that gives them hope for the future, and the care and warmth that gives them the chance to love and be loved.

ST. PATRICK'S PROGRAMS:

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM

The Residential Treatment Program is dedicated to provide quality care, treatment and education for emotionally disturbed adolescent girls. These young ladies need a structured environment to work on their emotional and psychiatric difficulties.

St. Patrick's Residential Program has an RCL rating, thus providing services to the

most serious emotional and behavioral problems. The residential program has a bed treatment facilities available. These group homes are located in the south area of Sacramento providing a family-like environment with a treatment orientation. The youth in the program are placed from throughout Northern California, but primarily from the greater Sacramento area. The youth are referred to our agency by county placing agencies, such as Community Mental Health, Health and Human Services, and Juvenile Probation, as well as private placements.

CHILD CARE PROGRAM

In 1972, St. Patrick's Home for Children, Inc. added a child care program at the Franklin Boulevard location in converted dormitories of the former orphanage. The Franklin Boulevard site of the child care program provides a full range of child care services for infants and children aged six weeks through thirteen years, thus the whole family can be served at one location. Children progress through our age-level programs (infant, toddler, preschool, and extended day) and parents do not have to look for a new center every few years as their child grows. The South Sacramento area has a large minority population, and many single parent households in need of these services.

In 1977 a second location was opened on Florin Road at the site of the former St. Paul Church. The Florin Road Center provides services in an area where there is limited availability for the low income population. Our State-funded Toddler Center at the Florin Road site, has a mission to provide quality child care for children from 18 months through 36 months old. Priority placement is given to migrant farm worker families, Child Protective Services children, AFDC recipients, low income families, and single parent families.

FOSTER CARE PROGRAM

In 1995, St. Patrick's Home for Children added a Foster Care Program and in 2001 expanded that program to include Adoptions. Our mission in this program is to place children who have been removed from their homes in a culturally similar supportive foster home environment. We work with the children and their families to quickly reunite the family unit, if possible. If a child cannot be reunified with their biological family, an adoptive family is desired to create a permanent home for the child. Family and individual counseling is provided to expedite this process.

Other Amenities

Also available for use by the youth in our programs at the Franklin Boulevard site are:

- St. Patrick's School Gymnasium
- Grounds for baseball, youth soccer and football programs
- St. Patrick's McMahon pool

TAX INFORMATION

St. Patrick's Home for children was incorporated as a nonprofit corporation in 1987, and it has been granted a section 501(c)(3) status by the Internal Revenue Service.
