"THE DISCIPLE WHOM JESUS LOVED"

One of the most interesting questions in the gospel is who is "The disciple whom Jesus loved." Didn't Jesus love all his disciples? Did Jesus love one disciple more than the others? Who is being designated by this strange reference?

This expression, found only in the Gospel of John, is puzzling in itself.

Also, why is "disciple" used as a person's name? According to Nelson's Complete Concordance of the New American Bible, the term disciple (in the singular) is used twice in Matthew, not at all in Mark, twice in Luke and 18 times in John. The plural form is used many times in all the Gospels.

When Peter goes to learn news about Jesus' trial, he is accompanied by "another disciple," who is known to the high priest (see 18: 15-16). Scripture scholar John L. McKenzie wrote that this might be the Apostle John (Dictionary of the Bible).

On Easter Sunday morning, Mary Magdalene reports the empty tomb to Peter and "the other disciple." They both run to the tomb and confirm that it is empty. In 21:2 we read about Peter, Thomas, Nathaniel, the sons of Zebedee (James and John), plus two unnamed disciples. In verse seven, "the disciple whom Jesus loved" is the first to realize that Jesus is the man standing at the shore while they fish. That disciple exclaims, "It is the Lord!"

After everyone has eaten bread and fish by the seashore, Jesus speaks with Peter, telling him to "feed my lambs,"

"tend my sheep" and "feed my sheep" (21: 15-17). Then Peter questions Jesus about this disciple whom Jesus loved (21:20) and who had reclined next to Jesus at the Last Supper (13:23-25).

Around the year 180, Irenaeus of Lyon identified the "beloved disciple" as the Apostle John, whom Irenaeus also presumed wrote the Gospel of John. Over the centuries, Christians have generally shared these two assumptions.

In his Introduction to the New Testament (Doubleday, 1997) Raymond E. Brown, S.S., identified three other theories about the identity of the beloved disciple. First, that he may have been a known New Testament figure (such as Lazarus, John, Mark or Thomas). Second, that he is not an historical person but a symbol for the ideal disciple.

Brown continues: "Third, still other scholars (with whom I agree) theorize that the Beloved Disciple was a minor figure during the ministry of Jesus, too

unimportant to be remembered in the more official tradition of the Synoptics. But since this figure became important in Johannine community history (perhaps the founder of the community), he became the ideal in its Gospel picture, capable of being contrasted with Peter as closer to Jesus in love."

The identity of "the beloved disciple" is an intriguing question, but what matters even more is that our faith is as alert and as generous as this disciple's.

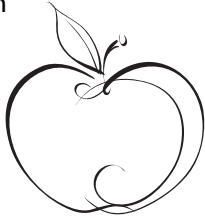

NEXT SUNDAY – THE FEAST OF THE ASCENSION:

The Feast of the Ascension is traditionally the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, commemorating the Ascension of Christ into heaven. The very word "ascension" signifies that Christ was raised up by His own powers. Although no written evidence of it exists prior to the beginning of the fifth century, St. Augustine says that it is of Apostolic origin, and he speaks of it in a way that shows it was the universal observance of the Church long before his time.

Liturgically, the day is meant to celebrate the completion of the work of our salvation, the pledge of our glorification with Christ, and His entry into heaven with our human nature glorified.

Holy Family Church will celebrate the Ascension next weekend, May 7 - 8. From the US Conference of Catholic Bishops: "In several ecclesiastical provinces of the United States of America, the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is transferred from May 5, 2005, to the following Sunday, May 8, 2005. Thursday, May 5, is observed as an Easter weekday in those archdioceses and dioceses."

COME CELEBRATE A HOLY HOUR WITH YOUR PARISH FAMILY

On Wednesday, May 11, 2005, at 7:00 pm in the church, Holy Family Parish will celebrate a Holy Hour.

A Catholic Dictionary defines Holy Hour as "a pious devotional exercise consisting of mental and vocal prayer with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament." The concept of a Holy "Hour" was inspired by Christ's words to His apostles in Gethsemane, "Can you not watch one hour with me?"

A Holy Hour consists of the Exposition of the Eucharist, Adoration, Benediction and Reposition. This "sacramental ritual" is rooted in the Passion of Christ – in the Eucharist – and its celebration leads us to focus on the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and to keep the Eucharist where it belongs, at the center of our lives.

Exposition

Exposition is honoring the Holy Eucharist by exposing it, with proper solemnity and reverence, to the view of the assembled faithful so that they may offer their devotion before it. Exposition begins with the priest and his assistants in procession, then the Blessed Sacrament is taken out of the tabernacle and exposed upon the altar in a monstrance, surrounded with candles, while the assembly sings the "O Salutaris Hostia."

Adoration

Adoration consists of scripture readings, a homily, songs, public and silent prayer, and silent reflection. The community prayer during adoration takes on various forms, one of the most common of which is the Liturgy of the Hours, or Evening Prayer. Holy Family will use this format for our Holy Hour.

Benediction

After Adoration, the priest, his shoulders covered with the humeral veil, takes the monstrance into his hands and blesses the assembly by making the sign of the cross over them with the Blessed Sacrament while they sing the "Tantum Ergo."

Reposition

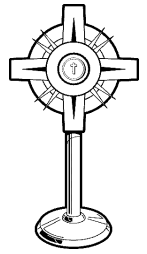
When the priest has completed the blessing - the Benediction - he then returns the Blessed Sacrament to the tabernacle and genuflects. The assembly recites the Divine Praises and sings an appropriate hymn of praise, concluding the Holy Hour.

Any opportunity for adoration of the Eucharist is a blessing, and Holy Family is truly blessed with the availability of daily adoration. The occasion of the Holy Hour gives us an additional opportunity, and we look forward to offering many such Holy Hours throughout the church year.
