INFANT BAPTISM

People often ask why do Catholic's baptize babies? You have to be an adult to follow Jesus. Where does the Bible say that babies are to be baptized?

In Philippi, St. Paul baptized his jailer "and all his family" (Acts 16:33). That does not prove that children were included, but it seems possible, even likely. In Ephesians 6: 1-3 we read: "Children, obey your parents [in the Lord] for this is right. Honor your father and mother. This is the first commandment with promise, 'that it may go well with you and that you may have a long life on earth.'"

St. Paul also writes, "Children, obey your parents in everything, for this is pleasing to the Lord" (Colossians 3:20).

Why would St. Paul write advice to children if they were not considered part of the Church?

The strongest biblical evidence for baptizing children is probably Matthew 19:13-15. "Then children were brought to him that he might lay his hands on them and pray. The disciples rebuked them, but Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.' After he placed his hands on them, he went away."

The Greek verb koluein, translated as "not prevent," was earlier used in Mark 10: 14 and in Luke 18: 16 in the same context. It appears again in Acts 8:36 when the Ethiopian eunuch asks, "What is to prevent my being baptized?" This verb is used again when Peter is ready to baptize the Roman centurion Cornelius (Acts 10:47) and when Peter later justifies that decision (II: 17). Is all this a coincidence? Maybe, maybe not.

The introduction for the Rite of Baptism for Children quotes John 3:5, "Unless a man is reborn in water and the

Holy Spirit he cannot enter the kingdom of God", and then comments: "The Church has always understood these words to mean that children should not be deprived of Baptism, because they are baptized in the faith of the Church, a faith proclaimed for them by their parents and godparents, who represent both the local Church and the whole society of saints and believers: 'The whole Church is the mother of all and the mother of each' [St. Augustine of Hippo].

To fulfill the true meaning of the sacrament, children must later be formed in the faith in which they have been baptized. The foundation of this formation will be the sacrament itself that they have already received. Christian formation, which is their due, seeks to lead them gradually to learn God's plan in Christ, so that they may ultimately accept for themselves the faith in which they have been baptized" (2-3).

The Church has baptized children since the first century of its life. Was it mistaken about this for another 15 centuries until this practice was challenged by some Protestant Reformers? I doubt that.

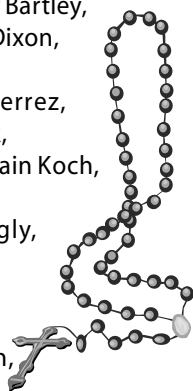
Consciously or unconsciously, parents are always passing on values to their children. Why shouldn't they pass on their faith? To insist that only adults can be baptized risks the heresy of Pelagianism, which said that human effort matters most regarding salvation.

Every baptized person needs to mature in his or her faith. If the Church baptized only adults, that would almost guarantee a false sense of security, a conviction that ongoing conversion is no longer necessary. That is not the Good News that Jesus preached. Only in heaven will we have "arrived."

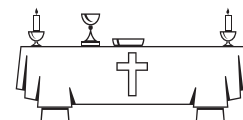

THE FEAST OF THE ASCENSION:

Holy Family Church celebrates the Ascension this weekend, May 7 - 8. From the US Conference of Catholic Bishops: "In several ecclesiastical provinces of the United States of America, the solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is transferred from May 5, 2005, to the following Sunday, May 8, 2005. Thursday, May 5, is observed as an Easter weekday in those archdioceses and dioceses."

The Feast of the Ascension is traditionally the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, commemorating the Ascension of Christ into heaven. The very word "ascension" signifies that Christ was raised up by His own powers. Although no written evidence of it exists prior to the beginning of the fifth century, St. Augustine says that it is of Apostolic origin, and he speaks of it in a way that shows it was the universal observance of the Church long before his time. Liturgically, the day is meant to celebrate the completion of the work of our salvation, the pledge of our glorification with Christ, and His entry into heaven with our human nature glorified.

COME CELEBRATE A HOLY HOUR WITH YOUR PARISH FAMILY

On Wednesday, May 11, 2005, at 7:00 pm in the church, Holy Family Parish will celebrate a Holy Hour.

A Catholic Dictionary defines Holy Hour as "a pious devotional exercise consisting of mental and vocal prayer with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament." The concept of a Holy "Hour" was inspired by Christ's words to His apostles in Gethsemane, "Can you not watch one hour with me?"

A Holy Hour consists of the Exposition of the Eucharist, Adoration, Benediction and Reposition. This "sacramental ritual" is rooted in the Passion of Christ – in the Eucharist – and its celebration leads us to focus on the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist and to keep the Eucharist where it belongs, at the center of our lives.

Exposition

Exposition is honoring the Holy Eucharist by exposing it, with proper solemnity and reverence, to the view of the assembled faithful so that they may offer their devotion before it. Exposition begins with the priest and his assistants in procession, then the Blessed Sacrament is taken out of the tabernacle and exposed upon the altar in a monstrance, surrounded with candles, while the assembly sings the "O Salutaris Hostia."

Adoration

Adoration consists of scripture readings, a homily, songs, public and silent prayer, and silent reflection. The community prayer during adoration takes on various forms, one of the most common of which is the Liturgy of the Hours, or Evening Prayer. Holy Family will use this format for our Holy Hour.

Benediction

After Adoration, the priest, his shoulders covered with the humeral veil, takes the monstrance into his hands and blesses the assembly by making the sign of the cross over them with the Blessed Sacrament while they sing the "Tantum Ergo."

Reposition

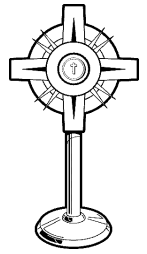
When the priest has completed the blessing - the Benediction - he then returns the Blessed Sacrament to the tabernacle and genuflects. The assembly recites the Divine Praises and sings an appropriate hymn of praise, concluding the Holy Hour.

Any opportunity for adoration of the Eucharist is a blessing, and Holy Family is truly blessed with the availability of daily adoration. The occasion of the Holy Hour gives us an additional opportunity, and we look forward to offering many such Holy Hours throughout the church year.
