"THE CHURCH"

What is the church? How are we to be church today? How can we learn more about what we are to be as a church? In the next six weeks, I hope to cover these and other questions in my Servant Leader column. I hope you find our bulletin helpful in many ways and try to use it for educational purposes as well as news items. You may want to save this column each Sunday so that you have all the pieces at the end of the six weeks.

You and all of us at Holy Family Catholic Church are the church of God. I give thanks for you as I see many of the quotes of these articles lived out in yourselves day to day in this holy place. May the Holy Spirit lead us into a deeper awareness of who we are blest to be and give us the strength to follow God's will for our lives.

"WHAT IS YOUR CHURCH LIKE?"

This question is posed where large groups of Catholics have been assembled. The responses to this question often begin with comments about the church building. Only secondarily does the response shift to descriptions of the congregation.

"Our church is really beautiful. It has nice statues and a warm atmosphere. It's very large but everyone has a good view of the altar."

"Our church is really modern. We had to build a brand new one because the old church was too small. The new one's kind of stark. It doesn't feel 'holy.' I really miss our old church."

If we reflect more deeply on the question, we realize that the Church is, of course, more than a building. The Church is first and foremost a people – the people of God, the body of Christ. If we want to know more about the Church from a Biblical perspective, we have to go beyond bricks.

Through the Easter season, the Sunday and daily Masses provided just such an opportunity through readings from the Acts of the Apostles.

Summary of References to "Church" in Acts:

- 11:19 - 26 A Description of the Church at Antioch where the members of the community were first called "Christians"
- 15:1 - 21 The story of the Council of Jerusalem, where the fateful decision to reach out to the gentiles was made and confirmed by the apostles Peter and James
- 16:11 - 15 Paul's missionary journey by sea from Asia Minor to the European continent, and the conversion of Lydia and her household
- 16:22 - 34 Rescue of Paul and Silas from their imprisonment in Philippi, leading to the conversion of the jailer and his household
- 17:15 -18:1 Paul's evangelizing in Athens and the speech on the Areopagus
- 23:6 - 11 Paul's appearance before the Sanhedrin and the split between the Sadducees and Pharisees about his ministry, leading to the revelation that Paul will "bear witness" to Jesus in Rome
- 28:16 - 20, 30 - 31 Paul's imprisonment in Rome and the continued effectiveness of his preaching

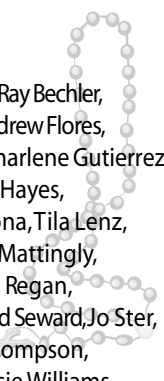

The Church Celebrates three Great Feasts:

Pentecost Sunday

Trinity Sunday

Feast of the Body of Christ

Sunday May 15 - Pentecost Sunday

This feast commemorates the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, fifty days after the Resurrection of Christ. The color of the priest's vestments is red, symbolic of the love of the Holy Spirit or of the tongues of fire.

This Pentecost Sunday, seventh graders from Holy Family School and Catholic Faith Formation will celebrate the **Sacrament of Confirmation** at the 6:00 pm Mass for Pentecost Sunday, with Bishop Quinn presiding. All are invited to join your parish family in celebrating this spirit-filled event. Adults from Holy Family participated in a Diocesan liturgy last weekend at Our Lady of Assumption Catholic Church in Carmichael, celebrated by Bishop Garcia.

Sunday May 22 - Trinity Sunday

The first Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday, instituted to honor the Most Holy Trinity. Pope John XXII (1316-1334) ordered the feast for the entire Church on the first Sunday after Pentecost, since it was after the first great Pentecost that the doctrine of the Trinity was proclaimed to the world.

Sunday May 29 - Feast of the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi)

Traditionally on Thursday after Trinity Sunday, the Feast is celebrated in honor of the Body of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and in commemoration of the institution of the Blessed Sacrament. It is held on the feastday or on the following Sunday and includes a Eucharistic procession concluded with Benediction. Holy Family's plans for the liturgy will be in next weekend's bulletin.

INCENSE SCHEDULE FOR SOLEMNITIES:

Incense will be used at the celebration of these solemnities with the following exceptions:

- Pentecost, May 15 - No incense at the 7:30 am Mass
- Trinity Sunday, May 22 - No incense at the 9:00 am Mass
- Corpus Christi, May 29 - No incense at the Noon Mass

This year marks the 50th anniversary of Mary's Hour. The celebration, which includes a procession, the praying of the Rosary, the crowning of Mary, and Benediction will commence at 1:30 p.m. For the last year, the Office of Hispanic Ministry, in cooperation with the Mary's Hour Committee, comprised of laity and clergy, have been planning this celebration. Father Brian Mullady, OP, will be the guest speaker and I will have the privilege of presiding. This year the theme of Mary's Hour is: "Praying with Mary, Woman of the Eucharist."

As in recent years, the event will reflect the multiple ethnic backgrounds of the faithful of the Sacramento Diocese. It is desirable that devotion to Mary be broad-based in its approach and truly representative of all of the faithful of our Diocese. There are many rich and diverse ways to express our devotion to Mary. When we pray with Mary, we are drawn closer to her Son, Jesus, who invites us to journey with him to new life. In Mother of the Redeemer, Pope John Paul II wrote: "It is precisely in this ecclesial journey or pilgrimage through space and time, and even more through the history of souls, that Mary is present, as the one who is 'blessed because she believed,' as the one who advanced on the pilgrimage of faith, sharing unlike any other creature in the mystery of Christ. The Council further says that 'Mary figured profoundly in the history of salvation and in a certain way unites and mirrors within herself the central truths of the faith.' Among all believers she is like a 'mirror' in which are reflected in the most profound ... way 'the mighty works of God' (Acts 2:11)." (Mother of the Redeemer, 25)

This Diocesan annual event can be an excellent opportunity to express devotion to Mary, who calls us to her Son and to a mission of love and unity, as we have experienced through our Diocesan Synod. It will afford an opportunity, also, to seek Mary's intercession for the needs of our parish communities, our country and for peace and justice around the world.
