### **ACTS AND THE NATURE OF THE CHURCH**

*(Part 2 in a series of 6:)*

*The Book of Acts is the only New Testament document devoted exclusively to the story of the early Church. It is the companion volume to the Gospel of Luke (compare the Prologues, Luke 1:1-4 and Acts 1:1-5). The Church uses this book at Mass almost exclusively through the Easter season, from Easter Sunday to Pentecost.*

*In order to provide the proper framework for reflecting on Acts, we should note first its general outline. The book has four main sections:*

- 1:1-5 Prologue
- 1:6 - 8:3 The Mission of the Church in Jerusalem and Environs
- 8:4 - 12:25 The Mission of the Church in Judea and Samaria
- 13:1 - 28:31 The Mission of the Church to the Ends of the Earth

*Acts gives a clue to this outline at 1:8. There the risen Jesus promises the gift of the Holy Spirit who will enable the apostles to be emboldened and to embark on worldwide missionary activity. The text reads: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." If you go to the end of Acts (Chapter 28), you will see that Paul's missionary journey takes him to Rome, considered the end's of the earth. For Acts, Rome is a symbol of the worldwide mission that the risen Jesus gave to the Church. The Church is foremost an evangelizing community. It is a people empowered by the Holy Spirit to take the message of Jesus Christ to the whole world. This message has not been lost on the Church today, Pope John Paul II regularly*

*called for a "new evangelization" in the life of the Church. He was basically calling us to recapture the spirit of Acts. The Easter season offers a good opportunity to rejuvenate this call. Acts provides the perfect resource, for much of the book consists of "speeches" that provide testimony about Jesus Christ and his significance to the world.*

- 3:11 - 26 Peter's speech at Solomon's Portico noting how Jesus fulfills God's promise to Abraham to be "the father of many nations"
- 4:23 - 31 A description of the prayer of the early Christian Community for God's protection
- 5:31 - 42 The trial of the apostles before the Sanhedrin, and the Pharisee Gamaliel's principle that, if the apostles' ministry is truly from God, it will prosper
- 7:51 - 8:1a The martyrdom of Stephen, the first martyr, whose death mirrors that of Jesus in Luke's Gospel (Luke 23:34, 46)
- 8:26 - 40 The apostle Philip and the conversion of the Ethiopian eunuch
- 9:1 - 20 The famous story of the conversion of Saul (Paul) on the road to Damascus
- 9:31- 42 Peter's healing of Aeneas, the paralyzed man, and the raising from the dead of the good disciple Tabitha, resulting in further conversions

**Trinity Sunday  
Feast of the Body of Christ**

**Sunday May 22 - Trinity Sunday**

The first Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday, instituted to honor the Most Holy Trinity. Pope John XXII (1316-1334) ordered the feast for the entire Church on the first Sunday after Pentecost, since it was after the first great Pentecost that the doctrine of the Trinity was proclaimed to the world.

**Sunday May 29 - Feast of the Body of Christ (Corpus Christi)**

Traditionally on Thursday after Trinity Sunday, the Feast is celebrated in honor of the Body of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament and in commemoration of the institution of the Blessed Sacrament. It is held on the feastday or on the following Sunday and includes a Eucharistic procession concluded with Benediction. Holy Family's plans for the liturgy will be in next weekend's bulletin.

## ARTICLE I: WHY ARE WE HERE?

*[As part of our ongoing celebration of the Year of the Eucharist, Holy Family will present each week this series "Three Minute Liturgical Catechesis through the remainder of the church year.]*

Pope John Paul II, declared the period from October 2004 through October 2005 the Year of the Eucharist. In his Apostolic Letter inaugurating the Year, *Mane Nobiscum Domine* (Stay with us, Lord), the Pope refers to "that mystagogical catechesis so dear to the Fathers of the Church, by which the faithful are helped to understand the meaning of the liturgy's words and actions, to pass from its signs to the mystery which they contain, and to enter into that mystery in every aspect of their lives." In that spirit these articles are offered to provide helpful materials for brief reflections on the Eucharist at Sunday Masses during this year. These materials are designed to take less than three minutes, so they won't delay us long from other things on our schedules. We'll be using them periodically throughout this year. We hope they give you a bit of information about the Mass and a bit of inspiration that will help you live the Eucharist all week long.

We begin today with a basic question for all of us: Why are we here? Why do we gather week after week for this liturgy we call the Mass?

There are probably a lot of answers to that question. Some of us come because it's a habit. Others come out of obligation. Some come because their parents insist on it. Some come for a time of relative peace and quiet. Others come to seek the Lord. Some come because they are burdened with problems. Others come because they are grateful for God's gifts. And many of us come for several of those reasons combined.

More basic than all of those reasons, however, we all come because God has called us here. It was God who chose us to be members of the Church. It was God who called us to share

God's own life through baptism. It was God who called us to carry on the mission of Christ in the world today. We come in response to God's call.

And we come for Eucharist, which comes from the Greek word for thanksgiving. We gather here each week to give God thanks and praise. Sometimes we may forget that. It's easy to focus on what we hope to get out of coming to church rather than on giving thanks for what God has already given us.

The most important thing we find when we gather here is the presence of Christ himself. Christ reveals his presence to us in various ways. He is present in our very gathering, living in each of us who are his tabernacles. He is present as the leader of our worship. He speaks directly to us when God's word is proclaimed in our midst. He offers us his own body and blood as our food and drink so that we will be more closely united with him and with one another.

We come because Christ is here and because he calls us. Through baptism we all became members of his body, and we come here to remember who we are. Here we are reunited with one another and with him who is our head. And when we leave here, we go forth carrying Christ with us, taking him to our world that is in such need of his presence and his love. He teaches us and feeds us here to strengthen us to be Christ-bearers all week. Let us go forth from this place to love and serve the Lord.
