### **YOUTH MINISTRY AT HOLY FAMILY**

This weekend you will hear from those in our parish who are charged with ministry to the young people of Holy Family Parish. These wonderful, caring and skilled people have accepted an enormous responsibility to serve our youth.

There has been tremendous growth in Catholic youth ministry since the early 1970s. With the publication in 1976 of A Vision of Youth Ministry (USCC, 1976), the Catholic Church in the United States began a renewal in ministry with youth that continues today. The Vision document outlined two goals for the Church's ministry with youth:

1. Youth Ministry must work for the total personal and spiritual growth of each young person.
2. Youth Ministry must seek to draw young people to responsible participation in the life, mission, and work of the faith community.

In 1997, the US bishops issued, Renewing the Vision: A Framework for Catholic Youth Ministry, building on the fine tradition begun by the 1976 document. Renewing the Vision focuses the church's ministry with adolescents on three essential goals:

1. Empowering young people to live as disciples of Jesus Christ in our world today;
2. Drawing young people to responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the faith community; and
3. Fostering the personal and spiritual growth of each young person.

Youth ministry is congregationally-owned. It is the commitment of the whole parish to serve young people of our community by creating an atmosphere for them to find, develop and share their own experience of Christian faith. At World Youth Day 1995, Pope John Paul II called on the church to become the "traveling companion of young people." We strive to lead our youth to a genuine faith in Jesus Christ, to encourage them to see their lives as disciples of Christ, and to give them the tools they need to minister to others.

Youth Ministry is fundamentally creating an environment for youth that is relevant and built on personal relationships. How we relate is more important than what we do. Relationships, rather than programs, are the primary vehicle for youth ministry. Programs are fine - in fact, they are needed - but should be directed at building and nurturing caring, trusted personal relationships. Every young Christian deserves an opportunity to experience and come to understand a true relationship with God.

The environment we create can go a long way toward making young people aware of their value to God, to their

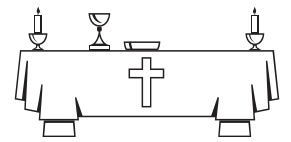
families and to this community of believers. This environment goes beyond the "meeting place" and the "group" - building and nurturing healthy relationships between young people and their families, equipping teens for a life of faith after high school, and providing opportunities for youth to serve Christ through different ministries.

One of the facets of Youth Ministry is faith formation. This is about helping young people grow in the grace, faith and knowledge of Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18), and deepening and strengthening their relationship with God. Faith formation happens in a number of places in addition to the parish - home, school and work, to name a few. In particular, a strong partnership between the congregation and the home is critically important in faith formation.

In their presentation this weekend, our youth ministry team will discuss the importance and the vision of Ministry to Youth in the Church; the role of Faith Formation, or catechesis, in Youth Ministry, including Confirmation as a full parish celebration of faith and life in community- one part of adolescent catechesis- not its culmination; and new ventures on the horizon for the youth of our parish - specifics about the Holy Family program and ministry to Jr. High and High School youth. I ask all young people in our parish family to please accept their invitation to meet with them after the Masses and to register for this vital program.

**A SUNDAY FOR CATECHISTS  
Q & A ABOUT CATECHETICAL SUNDAY**

**Why do we celebrate Catechetical Sunday?**

In 1935, the Vatican published On the Better Care and Promotion of Catechetical Education, a document that asks every country to acknowledge the importance of the Church's teaching ministry and to honor those who serve the Christian community as catechists. For the first few years after Catechetical Sunday was established, national catechetical congresses were held in conjunction with the celebration. Since 1971, the Department of Education of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has produced materials to help parishes celebrate the event at the local level.

**The word "catechetical" is unfamiliar to most people. What does it mean?**

The word might be more familiar than you think. Many Catholics have used the word "catechism" for years, and they know it has something to do with the compendium of the Church's teachings. The root word, "catechesis," is from a Greek word meaning "to echo, or resound." Catechesis is the act of resounding or bringing the Church's teachings to the world. A catechist is one who teaches in the name of the Church.

**Why do we have a special day set aside to commission catechists?**

Catechesis is a distinct and special ministry in the Church. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church makes clear, "Catechesis is intimately bound up with the whole of the Church's life... her inner growth and correspondence with God's plan depend essentially on catechesis" (no. 7). This ministry of teaching in the name of the Church has a profound dignity, which is why catechists are formally commissioned by the Church. It is only fitting that we set aside a day to highlight this ministry and invite the entire church community to think about our responsibility to share our faith with others.

**How are parents, the primary catechists of their children, recognized on Catechetical Sunday?**

Parents are truly the primary catechists of their children. They prepare the soil and plant the first seeds of faith. On Catechetical Sunday, we not only highlight the work of catechists in parishes and schools, but we also commend parents and guardians and encourage them to take seriously their role of making their Catholic households a place where the faith is passed on to the next generation. This is why the rite of blessing of catechists used on Catechetical Sunday includes an optional blessing of parents and guardians.

## ARTICLE 15: PREPARING THE GIFTS AND OURSELVES

*[As part of our ongoing celebration of the Year of the Eucharist, Holy Family presents each week this series "Three Minute Liturgical Catechesis through the remainder of the church year.]*

What do you call the part of the Mass that includes the collection? Many people still use its old name and talk about the Offertory of the Mass. The current liturgical books, on the other hand, call this part of the Mass the Preparation of the Gifts. This change in terminology was a deliberate one, as was noted by the pope's representative when the new missal was released in 1969.

The reason for changing the name of this section of the liturgy is that the real offertory of the Mass occurs in the Eucharistic Prayer. The sacrifice we offer is the sacrifice of Christ. No other sacrifice is acceptable and no other sacrifice is needed, as the Letter to the Hebrews insists. It is Christ who offers himself, and we join in that offering as we proclaim the Eucharistic Prayer.

So, then, what are we doing during the Preparation of the Gifts? The key word is preparation. In this part of the Mass, we are preparing for what is to come. This is symbolized by our preparation of the gifts of bread and wine that will become Christ's body and blood. In these few moments between the Liturgy of the Word and the Eucharistic Prayer, we make the preparations for the Eucharistic Meal and the great prayer of thanksgiving over the meal.

The key action during the Preparation of the Gifts is the procession to bring the gifts to the altar. This procession, though brief and generally simple, is more

than merely a practical matter of getting the bread and wine to the altar. It is an expression of our own preparation for entering into Christ's sacrifice. On Holy Thursday, the rubrics suggest that the whole assembly process to the altar with gifts for the poor. Even when only a few members of the assembly form the procession, they represent all of us. Their movement to the altar suggests the movement of our hearts toward the Lord and our willingness to share in the sacrifice offered on that altar.

Senior members among us may remember being taught to place themselves on the paten with the host when it was offered to God during the Offertory. The only problem with that approach is that the bread is not being offered to God. Only after it becomes the body of Christ is the sacrifice offered. Yet the image still has value. As the bread and the wine are prepared and placed on the altar, we can mentally place ourselves there, too, prepared to give of ourselves as Christ did, ready to share in his sacrificial offering.

This time to prepare ourselves during Mass can bring to completion our efforts to prepare ourselves all week. We are continually called to give of ourselves as Christ did, in loving service to our neighbors. We might begin each day with a prayer that we will always be ready to link ourselves to Christ's sacrifice, whether in church or wherever we happen to be.
