This weekend we celebrate Commitment Sunday - a truly joyful celebration of our commitment as a community to the Legacy Restoration Appeal. Unlike campaigns in other parishes and organizations where a commitment weekend often means putting people on the spot, we will use this time to celebrate our participation through the first two weeks of the appeal and to celebrate and pray for the success of our efforts going forward.

Responses to the Legacy Restoration Appeal have already begun coming in to the Parish Office. Once again, the wonderful people of Holy Family have shown their generosity as well as their responsibility to God and to each other. Today, Parish family members are given an opportunity without demand and without pressure to make their pledge if they choose to do so at this time, or to celebrate the commitment they have already sent in, or to offer prayers over pledges that may be made later from those with special circumstances and those who will join our parish family.

We are committed to making this appeal entirely in-house, with little or no overhead expense except mailing costs, without the help, or expense, of an outside fundraising firm and without a "hard sell" or personal visits. This program is based on numbers born out of first-hand experience, real financial assessment and finding homegrown, "family" solutions to "family" needs. Every family of Holy Family Parish and School is a valuable part of this appeal, and each has only to do their fair share to insure its success. The commitment of Holy Family parishioners through the years has brought us this far, and your benevolence has made it possible to leave a legacy for generations to come.

One very important facet of this plan is transparency. Throughout this program, we will keep every parish family member informed on how the plan is being administered and how their generosity is being put to its best use with a full year-end report in July 2006.

Again, it is vital that commitment to this appeal is above regular stewardship which must continue at present levels to maintain the regular parish expenses.

As part of Legacy, we will set aside the second Sunday of each month for fulfilling the commitment we have made to this vital appeal. Barring extraordinary occurrences like the tsunami and hurricane tragedies that parts of the world have experienced this year requiring our assistance, we will make every effort to ensure that there will be no outside second collections on these Second-Sunday weekends - we will use that time to make our monthly gift utilizing the envelopes that will be included with your regular stewardship envelopes beginning in November. (Envelopes for next Sunday are

included with today's bulletin and will be available in the pews.) You may choose to send in your Legacy offering at any time during the month or you may choose to do so quarterly or annually, yet we will continue to keep the second weekend as a special time to celebrate our family's commitment to leaving a legacy.

From the beginning, God's people were asked to give back to God a portion of their treasure. This giving is not because God needs the gifts, but because God's people need to give in order to remember to whom they belong. In our giving, we give honor to God and remind ourselves that life is not just what we make it, but what God has blessed it to be. As the famous educator William Arthur Ward wrote, "Giving is more than a responsibility - it is a privilege; more than an act of obedience - it is evidence of our faith." Today we make a commitment together to be faithful stewards of Holy Family Church, remembering and honoring God in each and every aspect of our lives, and celebrating God's abundant goodness to us

I know that you will do your best in this appeal, and together we will build up Holy Family Parish. Please continue to pray over the appeal information and make your personal commitment as God puts it in your heart. As I mentioned before, I will also be glad to personally receive your commitment and any notes or comments on whatever is on your mind. Thank you and God Bless!

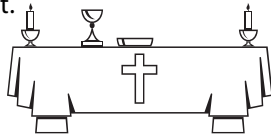

ARTICLE 20: THE WORDS THAT JESUS GAVE US

[As part of our ongoing celebration of the Year of the Eucharist, Holy Family presents each week this series "Three Minute Liturgical Catechesis through the remainder of the church year.]

If there is any prayer that could be called the model Christian prayer, it would surely be the Our Father.

We call it the Lord's Prayer, because it was given by Jesus to the disciples when they asked him to teach them how to pray. This is a prayer that has been used by Christians ever since, often several times a day. Early Christian writers speak of praying the Lord's Prayer every morning, at midday and every night. It has been the constant companion of Christians for two thousand years.

Since the early centuries of the Church's history, this prayer has also been used as part of our immediate preparation for receiving Communion. There are several aspects of the prayer that make it particularly appropriate for this part of the Mass.

First, of course, is the fact that this prayer prays for our daily bread. While this means more than just the Eucharist, it naturally calls to mind the Lord's gift of his body and blood as our food and drink. Second, it speaks of the forgiveness that enables the community to be reconciled with one another just as we are reconciled with God. Third, this prayer is addressed to Our Father, reminding us that we are one family in Christ as we come to share at the table of the Lord.

When this prayer first became part of the Mass, it was commonly said after the breaking of the bread. Near the beginning of the seventh century, Pope St. Gregory the Great moved it to its current position because he saw it as closely linked to the Eucharistic Prayer. It echoes the concerns of the Eucharistic Prayer that God be praised, that God's kingdom might come, and that God's will be done on earth as in heaven. Making this prayer our own can be a way of expressing some of the implications of our Amen to the Eucharistic Prayer.

Some people have become accustomed to holding hands during this prayer to express our unity. Others have learned to raise their hands in prayer. Neither gesture is prescribed in the official books, nor is either forbidden. Perhaps one of these locally developing trends will lead someday to a formal rubric in the liturgy.

The final petition of the prayer has long been

expanded to ask for peace. This expansion, called the embolism, is followed by the acclamation "For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours ... " The Byzantine Rite, one of the Eastern rites of the Church, normally concludes the Lord's Prayer with this acclamation, as do many of our brothers and sisters in other Christian churches. It seems to have been added to the prayer originally so that it would end on a more positive note than "deliver us from evil."

We say this prayer so often that it is good for us now and then to make a conscious effort to think about what we are saying. It is a prayer that challenges us to work for the things we pray for - to remember that we are one family, to make God's name holy, to work for the kingdom, to do God's will, to share our daily bread, to forgive as we are forgiven and to struggle against evil. It is a good prayer to pray several times a day.
