### PRIESTS OF THE DIOCESE GO BACK TO SCHOOL!

This past week, Fr. Santiago and I attended the annual Priests' Study Days at Christ the King Retreat Center. Each year, priests are expected to continue their studies (even the Bishops attend the study days) and also to make a yearly retreat. All Christians are called to prayer, study, renewal and the deepening of their faith and to a better understanding how they can live that faith.

Sometimes people think that they have learned the Catholic Faith if they went through the 8th Grade in Catholic Schools or attended Religious Education classes. It is wonderful to have at Holy Family a number of ways people can grow in their faith - Catholics Returning Home, RCIA, Bible Studies, Prayer Groups, Adult Confirmation Preparation, Parent Baptism Preparation, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and various other ministries. I encourage people to pray, read the Bible and use any opportunities that come along to grow in the knowledge of God and apply it to their lives.

The theme of the studies this past week was "Preaching the Just Word." The following is a summary of one of the presentations which I hope throws some light on what we are called to as God's people.

### BIBLICAL FOUNDATIONS OF PROPHETIC JUSTICE

In this course we discussed biblical justice as right order, right relationship, fairness, equality and freedom. We looked at justice rooted in the Nature of God - from the creation of humans in the divine image in Genesis, through divine liberation in Exodus through God's covenant with His People in Israel. We discussed the roles of the Prophet in Israelite society - foreteller, messenger, defender, representative and mediator; the foundations of prophetic condemnation of injustice - corrupt officials, economic oppression, false-hearted worship, deficit in the knowledge of God and restoration of the covenant; and, key elements of the prophets' concept and message of justice.

### CALLED TO PREACH JUSTICE

The study days clearly called priests to preach the justice issues of our day in the Spirit of Jesus. Sometimes people accuse us of bringing politics into the pulpit when we speak about the issues of the day - life issues such as abortion, care of the poor, care for prisoners, promotion of the family, concern for victims of crime, opposition to the death penalty, stem cell research and many other challenges that arise day to day in our world. We cannot be Catholics if we do not shine the light of the Gospel on every situation. It is easy to preach a pious message that does not challenge people but just makes them feel good; however, we cannot avoid the reality of living the Gospel.

In this Respect Life Month, I hope we will all have the courage to live the Gospel respecting life from conception to natural death.

## ARTICLE 22: THEY RECOGNIZED HIM IN THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

*[As part of our ongoing celebration of the Year of the Eucharist, Holy Family presents each week this series "Three Minute Liturgical Catechesis through the remainder of the church year.]*

When the disciples who met Jesus on the road to Emmaus invited him to join them for dinner, Luke's gospel tells us, they "recognized him in the breaking of the bread." (Luke 24:35) A bit later the book of Acts describes the life of the early Church this way: "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers." (Acts 2:42)

So "the breaking of the bread" was a phrase that early Christians used to describe the Mass. This ritual gesture was seen as central to the meaning of what they did when they gathered on Sunday.

The term can remind us of two significant points. We use the term "breaking bread" with friends or family as a way of speaking about sharing a meal together. Using this phrase to describe the Eucharist reminds us that the central ritual of our faith is a meal that we share with Christ. We spoke several weeks ago of the Mass as a sacrifice. It is also a meal. We might call it a sacrificial meal or a sacrifice in the form of a meal. Jesus chose a meal as the fundamental symbol of the Eucharist, and he reveals his presence in the breaking of the bread.

The breaking of the bread is a practical prerequisite for sharing a meal. In an age of pre-sliced loaves, we may need to remember that, in ancient times, bread was not sliced but commonly broken and shared. So the breaking of the bread speaks first of sharing, and thus it speaks of the union that we call Communion. Our liturgical prayers often speak of our sharing one bread and one cup as a symbol of our unity in the one Christ. We break the bread in order to share the one loaf.

This practical action, however, has also taken on a symbolic meaning. Christ's body was broken for us and his blood was poured out for us. So breaking the bread also reminds us of Christ's sacrifice. In the process, it reminds us of our commitment to share in his sacrifice. If we love as he did, we have to be willing to allow ourselves to be broken and our energy poured out. We have to be willing to allow ourselves to be consumed by others. We have to be willing to be the body of Christ, and that means we have to be willing to nourish those around us.

We do not do this exactly as Christ does, of course. We are broken and poured out and consumed figuratively, but the commitment is the same as that of Jesus. It is our willingness to love as deeply and as widely as he does that is crucial.

This deeper meaning of the ritual action is emphasized by the song that accompanies it. The "Lamb of God" speaks of Jesus as the lamb of sacrifice, who takes away the sins of the world and grants us peace.

The breaking of the bread is another element of the Communion Rite that helps us prepare ourselves to enter into intimate union with Christ and with all our brothers and sisters.
