A MESSAGE FROM POPE BENEDICT XVI:

PREPARE FOR ADVENT & CHRISTMAS WITH "SPIRITUAL FERVOR"

In his general audience on November 23, Pope Benedict XVI encouraged Christians to prepare for Advent and Christmas with "spiritual fervor."

"I ask you all to prepare for Advent with spiritual fervor, drawing from the word of God and the Eucharist interior energy for welcoming the Lord who comes," he said at the end of his address.

Having spent many of his recent audiences teaching about the Psalms, the Holy Father today shifted his attention to the opening canticle of St. Paul's Letter to the Ephesians, "God the Savior"; calling it a "constant stream of praise rising up to God."

The pope said the hymn picks up similar "blessings" found in the Jewish tradition, but praises God as the "Father of Our Lord Jesus Christ."

The central figure is Christ, "in whom the work of God the Father is revealed and accomplished," the pope said.

By professing that Christians are chosen in Christ, filled with abundant grace and are made adopted sons and daughters of God through Christ, the hymn underlines the Christian vocation to brotherhood, unity and holiness, the pope said.

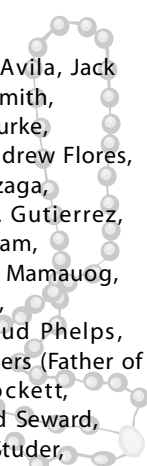
The hymn, he said, emphasizes the "excess, the giving without limit or reserve" of God's grace out of love and the fact that all creation was destined from the beginning of time to be united in Christ.

Pope Benedict ended his talk by saying, "Let us pray: 'Yes, Lord, draw us to yourself, draw the world to yourself and give us peace.'"

WHAT IS WORLD YOUTH DAY?

World Youth Day is a day to celebrate youth, specifically the younger and older teens in our midst, in all of their diversity and goodness, and to encourage these young people to lead the church both now and into the future. The Bishops of the United States, wanting to place full attention on the youth of our nation, voted to move the celebration in the U.S. from Palm Sunday to the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Due to unforeseen circumstances during the month of October, our parish celebration of this occasion was moved to this weekend.

During this weekend, our parish community is invited to bless our young people at each mass, to affirm their presence among us, and to invite them to use their gifts and talents in service to the Church and the world. To assist our parish in serving our youth, part of this Sunday's second collection will go to the youth ministry program.

Holy Family is continuing work to restructure and revitalize the way we minister to our Jr. High and High School Youth. This is no easy task, so your prayers and support are very necessary. Every adult member of our community is called in one way or another to be a "youth minister" – one who cares for and nurtures youth and travels with them through adolescence to adulthood. Our youth are indeed the future of the church, but they are also very much part of the church that is happening today. We challenge you this weekend to help us make Holy Family a community of love, support, vitality, openness, and acceptance for the young people among us.

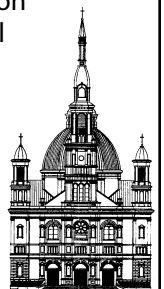

A Season of Preparation and Anticipation

The Jesse Tree

The Jesse Tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot will spring forth from the stump of Jesse, and a branch out of his roots." This Advent tradition is a symbolic way to tell the Story of God's people and to connect the Advent Season with the faithfulness of God across 4,000 years of history.

The symbol of a branch is used throughout the Old Testament as a sign of hope, a symbol of the promise of renewal overcoming discouragement which was a central part of the discussion and anticipation of the long-awaited Messiah. This makes it a fitting symbol of Jesus Christ, who is the embodiment of the mercy, grace and faithfulness of God. The tree is adorned with symbols to represent history:
