† Servant Leader † **CELEBRATING "LITTLE CHRISTMAS"**

This weekend we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord which traditionally marks the appearance of the three "kings", symbolic of all the peoples of the world, before the newborn Savior. Christ has "appeared" in the world for each one of us, to bring us salvation, redemption and the promise of everlasting joy.

We bring our gifts to Christ Jesus just as the kings brought gifts. While we cannot ever repay Christ for all He has done for us, we can offer our praise and gratitude as we accept the priceless gifts He offers to us. The three gifts of the kings are symbolic of what our gratitude is comprised of: gold - love, frankincense - prayer, and myrrh - sacrifice.

Love, of which gold is only a symbol, is what Christ wants from all of us. This love may be defined simply as complete surrender to His will. The will of God, made known through Christ, is our true source of happiness.

Scripture speaks of prayer rising like incense to the throne of God. It is as a symbol of prayer that incense is used in solemn liturgical celebrations. The reality is always greater than the symbol. Christ asks all of us constantly to offer Him the gift of our prayers.

Myrrh was a bitter but valuable liquid known to ancient peoples as a preservative. It makes a rich symbol for the sacrifices and sufferings Christ asks from those who love Him. As always, when we look closely at this gift Christ asks us to give Him, we find that in giving the gift we enrich ourselves. Christ never asks those who love Him to suffer anything that does not lead to their happiness in some divine way. He told us that we would all have sorrows, but in the same breath He added that every sorrow would be turned into unbelievable joy.

As our celebration of Epiphany brings the Christmas Season to a close, we take time to reflect on the many blessings that the season has given us. While we have celebrated the tremendous gift of Christ's birth, and the gifts of the kings, and the gifts we have shared with our loved ones, and the gifts we have been able to offer those less fortunate this season, we have continued to receive and share the greatest gift of all - the Eucharist, gifted to us by Christ and offered to us continually in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

The wonderful, inspiring liturgies we have celebrated through the Christmas Season have helped us to keep our focus on what truly matters in this world. Liturgy is the celebration of the whole community, and each one of us has had a role in making them come to life. In addition, many individual parishioners have helped in special ways to make our Christmas Masses special spiritual experiences by fulfilling roles in liturgical ministry. Fr. Santiago, Deacon Mark and I would like to offer our sincere gratitude to all those who made such contributions to our liturgies.

"Thank You" to those whose hard work again transformed our church into God's own Winter Wonderland by decorating the sanctuary, the vestibule and the whole church so beautifully for the Season, and to all whose gifts enhanced our worship environment with donations of beautiful poinsettias and trees.

"Thank You" to the Liturgy Council and all those who assisted in planning the liturgies of the season - individuals from Catholic Faith Formation, Holy Family School, Youth Ministry, the Hispanic Apostolate and the parish at large who worked with the Liturgy Council to prepare the celebrations that marked the season so wonderfully.

Hope to see you there, it's an experience you'll remember.

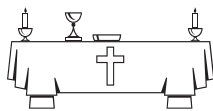

Yes, it is that time of year again-RESOLUTIONS! And we attempt to achieve a more healthful lifestyle. Health Ministry is here to support your efforts.

We are pleased to invite you to an open house in our office in the Community Center this Sunday, Jan. 8th, 2006 from 8:30 am to 1:15 pm. We will be taking blood pressures in the office during and after the pancake breakfast. It is our hope that each member of our Holy Family Community will take advantage of the health education and wellness programs as well as informational resources this year in both English and Spanish.

Thanks to Fr. Kiernan and some very industrious parishioners a few new changes have taken place to enhance the effectiveness of our services.

No, you are not seeing double. Health Ministry has two Parish RNs named Clair and Clare. The Health Ministry office will now be open each Tuesday and Thursday from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm for scheduled and unscheduled appointments. You may call the office for an appointment at 721-0388. Currently, we do not have voice mail but you can reach us during the hours stated above.

Blood pressure checks will continue to be done on the 1st Sunday of the month after the 7:30 am Mass and will continue for ALL parishioners until 1:15 pm. It is our hope to have an interpreter to assist us after the 10:30 Mass for those non English speaking Hispanic parishioners.

Health information notices will be posted in the weekly bulletin in both English and Spanish to help assure effective communication with all of our parishioners.

It is important to the success of the program to have a Health Ministry Committee to advise and suggest health programs and priorities specific to this parish. Three volunteers plus one bilingual Hispanic parishioner are requested to assist us in planning a dynamic program for the Holy Family Community.
