### **HOLY FAMILY SCHOOL SHINES IN ACCREDITATION PROCESS**

Congratulations and thanks to Sr. Arlene and the faculty, staff, students and parents of Holy Family School upon completion of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and Western Catholic Education Association (WCEA) certification process.

Holy Family School has been accredited since 1994 and began the process of reaccreditation about two years ago. Through 18 months (plus) of commitment and hard work, the school staff completed the first phase, a comprehensive self-study, which was submitted earlier this year. The next step was the arrival of a visiting committee to analyze the self-study, observe the school in operation, visit classrooms and prepare a report outlining its findings.

The Visiting Committee was here at Holy Family February 7 - 9 and presented a report to Holy Family and the WASC Accreditation Commission. I am more than pleased to say that the report was a resounding, magnificent affirmation of our school. In a nutshell, the report confirmed that Sr. Arlene and her faculty and staff did an outstanding job of fulfilling the recommendations of the previous accreditation findings, performed with excellence in the criteria on which accreditation is granted and presented a comprehensive, progressive plan for continued growth and excellence.

The visiting committee also recognized the support and cooperation Holy Family School receives from the parish community, for which I am grateful to the wonderful, generous people of this parish family.

### **Why do schools go through the accreditation process?**

- Certification to the public that the school is a trustworthy institution of learning
- Validation of the integrity of a school's program and student transcripts
- Improvement of the school's programs and operations to support student learning
- Management of change through regular assessment, planning, implementing, monitoring and reassessment
- Establishment of priority areas for improvement through a process of self-assessment, the insight and perspective of a visiting committee and regular school staff assessment of progress between full self-studies

Accreditation is required or expected in one way or another for University of California approval of courses, Cal Grants, private colleges and universities, recruiting for many teaching positions with respect to a teacher's prior schools of employment, military recruiters and many school districts when it comes to accepting credits from other schools.

### **The Purpose of Accreditation**

The process developed by WASC involves a dual purpose: ensuring that a school meets the expectation that it is worthy of the trust of its community (and well beyond) to provide high quality learning opportunities, and the added requirement that the school clearly demonstrate that it is about the critical business of continual self-improvement.

Ultimately, the accreditation process is all about fostering excellence in education. The accreditation process is a vehicle that enables schools to improve student learning and school performance based on an analysis of the school's strengths and limitations.

### **The basic WASC criteria are organized by the following categories:**

- Organization for Student Learning
- Curriculum and Instruction
- Support for Student Personal and Academic Growth
- Resource Management and Development

The accreditation process applied to Holy Family School is the result of joint efforts of WASC and the Western Catholic Education Association (WCEA). These two groups synthesized the issues and concerns of their constituencies to develop a process that addresses:

1. How are the students doing with respect to the expected schoolwide learning results?
2. Is the school doing everything possible to support high achievement of these results for all its students?
3. To what extent are the WCEA standards (and descriptive characteristics) relating to Catholic identity infused into the total school program?

This third area emphasizes the great blessing of making a Catholic Education available to our children. Being able to recognize and nurture the presence of Christ in the midst of our children has immeasurable value.

Again, I offer sincere congratulations to Sr. Arlene and to all those who serve our children so wonderfully. They are truly a blessing to Holy Family.
