THE IMPORTANCE OF BLOOD PRESSURE SCREENING

Well, here it is the first week of March and we've begun our Lenten journey. Since Health Ministry is also starting on a new journey here at Holy Family, I thought it appropriate to provide you with some educational material to place on your reminder boards at home.

Blood Pressure screening has been done here in the Parish for many years on the 1st Sunday of each month. Over time, the attendance has decreased. In an effort to educate you about the importance of keeping your blood pressure under control, I hope you will take time to read the insert and question your personal numbers. If you do not keep track of your numbers, Health Ministry suggests you start now. Blood Pressure screening is now provided conveniently in grocery stores, pharmacies, your physician's office, your home and other agencies in the area.

The key to accurate monitoring is to use the same equipment serially. On any given day, your blood pressure may be elevated, normal or decreased. To determine your normal reading, use the same Blood Pressure machine over a period of a few days or weeks at various times of the day. Generally, you can discard the very high and low numbers and a personal pattern will emerge. Keep a record of the readings so that you can show them to your physician. New digital equipment may be more accurate than an old blood pressure cuff that has not been calibrated in many years. A few tips for accuracy are:

1. Sit down and relax for about 20 minutes before taking your pressure.
2. Be sure that the cuff is the correct size for your arm--very small arm circumference--use a child's cuff; a very stout arm--use an extra large cuff.
3. Rest your arm (preferably the left--unless you have had breast cancer, have a shunt for dialysis, etc.) on a surface level with the machine you are using.
4. Do not take your blood pressure immediately after eating. We hope the information provided will assist you in your quest for good health.

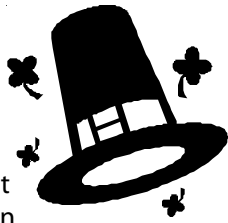


PANCAKE BREAKFAST TODAY!
