DO AS I HAVE DONE

"When he had washed their feet, and taken his garments, and resumed his place, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord; and you are right, for so I am. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." (John 13:12-15).

The Lord Jesus washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper as a sign of the new commandment that Christians should love one another: "Such as my love has been for you, so must your love be for each other. This is how all will know you for my disciples: by your love for one another" (see John 13, 34-35). For centuries the Church has imitated the Lord through the ritual enactment of the new commandment of Jesus Christ in the washing of feet on Holy Thursday.

Holy Family Parish will celebrate this tradition at our Holy Thursday Mass this week. Fr. Santiago, Deacon Mark and I will wash the feet of 12 members of the parish (representing the apostles) who will, in turn, wash the feet of others. You are invited, not only to come forward and have your feet washed, but to wash the feet of others, as well. The foot washing will take place at "stations" throughout the church and once your feet have been washed, you may offer to take the place of that person and continue the ministry of service initiated by Christ.

Complete details of this ritual action will be given at the celebration, and I offer this quick preview so that you may be prepared and the ritual may be as smooth and efficient as possible without detracting from the powerful spiritual experience of the moment.

The liturgy is always an act of unity and Christian charity, of which the Holy Thursday foot washing rite is an eminent sign. We all need to obey the Lord's new commandment to love one another with an abundance of love, especially at this most sacred time of the liturgical year when the Lord's passion, death, and resurrection are remembered and celebrated in the powerful rites of the Triduum.

The Holy Thursday Mass is full of symbolism and ritual as we celebrate the washing of feet, the reception of holy oils blessed at the Diocesan Chrism Mass, the institution of the priesthood and, above all, the solemn commemoration of the institution of the Holy Eucharist. And Thursday is just the beginning!

Please take some time, as soon as possible, to review the center spread of today's bulletin to see all the wonderful, spiritual events that will mark this most sacred of weeks at Holy Family Parish. I look forward to sharing the journey with you as we walk the path to the Glorious Resurrection of Jesus Christ at next weekend's Easter celebrations.

All members of our Holy Family are encouraged to attend as many of the special events of this sacred week as possible. Just as important, we are commissioned to bring the good news to those around us by inviting others to celebrate with us - family members, neighbors, co-workers, to name a few.

We need to spread the word to anyone who might not normally take part to make sure they know they are truly welcome in God's house to experience the wonder and awe of this week's celebrations.

This commissioning goes beyond Holy Week. Please read the information below and pass it along...

CATHOLICS RETURNING HOME

Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find non-practicing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these loved ones however we don't know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our non-practicing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Secondly, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the Catholic Church. Most non-practicing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many non-practicing Catholics carry a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church so they are afraid of approaching the Church for fear of being rejected. You can make a tremendous difference in someone's life simply by reaching out to them and telling them that we miss them and would like for them to come back home to our Church family.

Here at Holy Family we have a special program to help non-practicing Catholics return to the Church called Catholics Returning Home. The next series begins April 20th. PENANCE AND RECONCILIATION SERVICE:

Lent is a season of baptismal renewal and penitential reflection – a time to turn away from evil and walk in the way of the Lord. An integral part of this is the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Reconciliation is a part of all sacraments, particularly present in the sacraments of initiation, the focus of our Lenten preparation. Not only are we taking part in the preparation of the elect for their initiation at the Easter Vigil, but the Lenten path leads all of us to the sacrament of reconciliation, which frees us from the weight of sin, restores our baptismal gifts and reconciles us with God and the whole church.

We will celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation communally this week, not for expediency or convenience, but because it is truly a community event. Pope John Paul II wrote, "there is no sin, not even the most intimate and secret one, the most strictly individual one, that exclusively concerns the person committing it. With greater or lesser violence, with greater or lesser harm, every sin has repercussions on the entire ecclesial body and the whole human family."

Thus, as sin affects the whole community, so does reconciliation have an effect on the whole community. Healing is present in the community of the church, and all are welcome - individuals need to be aware that they are welcome into the life of the church and the church needs to be welcomed into the life of the individual. We all need Christ's loving forgiveness, and we need each other to know that his forgiveness is real.

Fr. Richard Parks who so wonderfully helped us to begin our Lenten Journey with a Parish Mission will share this evening with us and bring the season full-circle to the message of Life Giving Water that began with the mission.

EXPERIENCE THE GOSPEL OF MARK

On the evening of April 12th, the Wednesday of Holy week, we will have the opportunity to gather in the church to prayerfully hear the gospel of Mark proclaimed. The Gospel according to Mark is more than just a recording of events and sayings of Jesus. It is also an act of early Christian theology, as it deals with the mission and meaning of Jesus, and interprets this. The style of Mark is simple, yet despite the simplicity of its narrative construction is often very powerful and effective. Everyone is welcome to join us for this prayerful reflection on the life of Christ and his passion - an excellent opportunity to prepare for the celebration of the Triduum.

THE TRIDUUM BEGINS

The season of Lent comes to an end on the morning of Holy Thursday, and we begin the celebration of the Triduum. These three days are one great celebration from the evening of Holy Thursday through Easter Sunday. These three days are the most important days of celebration in the Catholic Church. The entire liturgical year leads up to the Triduum. During these three days, we follow Christ through His betrayal, death and resurrection. These sacred days are so central to our faith that every effort should be made to set aside our ordinary routines as much as possible, and to live the celebration, the services of the Triduum.

HOLY THURSDAY MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Holy Thursday mass celebrates the many facets of Jesus' last supper – the institution of the priesthood, the institution of the mass and the first Eucharist. Jesus instructs his disciples, as they too share in the Eucharist, that the path to salvation is paved by service - to wash each others' feet. Jesus provides a living example of how we are to be Eucharist for one another - by serving. We celebrate and thank God for the life-giving gift of the holy bread and wine, the body and blood of Jesus.

GOOD FRIDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

Jesus believed that everything he did was an act of love to the ones to whom God had sent him. (all of us) Even his dying was an act of love. It is in his dying that so many people find hope - women who have been abused, people who are oppressed, tortured, dying. And I believe that his dying was not the end, but the beginning. It is because of Jesus' death that Christians have hope. It is because of Jesus' death that human suffering (illness, madness, natural disaster, violence) is given some meaning. His death gives our suffering meaning and the potential for liberation and salvation.

HOLY LAND GOOD FRIDAY COLLECTION

From the daily news we all know of the challenges in the Middle East. Christians in the Holy Land urgently need our help. You can help fellow Catholics in the cradle of Christianity through your generosity. On Good Friday, our parish will take up the annual collection for the Holy Land. OUTDOOR STATIONS OF THE CROSS

Pope John Paul II described the Way of the Cross, Via Crucis, as a journey of many intentions:

- a journey of solidarity: Jesus, as he walks towards the Place of the Skull, is leading humanity towards the splendor of Glory.
- a journey of discipleship: Jesus, the one Teacher, has said: "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Mt 16: 24).
- a priestly and royal journey: Jesus, consecrated by the Spirit, is King and Priest; the meek and innocent Lamb offers himself, as a victim for the sin of the world.
- a journey of hope: As he walks to his death, Jesus knows that he is hastening towards the resurrection.
- a journey of fullness: The Way of the Cross is full of pain and unbounded love, of total abasement and sublime exaltation, of immense compassion and anxious expectation.

Good Friday evening at 7:30 pm members of Holy Family Youth Ministry will offer a dramatic presentation of the Stations of the Cross. This program is a wonderful, spirit-filled celebration - a definite "must experience" event. The Outdoor Stations are celebrated behind the school, or if it is raining, in the Church.

HOLY SATURDAY

Holy Saturday, a day when all creation waits, a quiet day, the day when "The Word of God through whom all had been made lay buried in the darkness of the earth." Creation waits for the Word to break forth again to make all things new. We need to remember this day, this peaceful day, this quiet day, when Jesus lay in the tomb, when the Word was silent and all of God's creation waited with hushed expectation for all things to be made new.

EASTER VIGIL ON THE HOLY NIGHT OF EASTER

After sunset, on Holy Saturday evening, the Church gathers in darkness to light fire, the Easter Fire. From that fire, we light the Christ candle, the Light that has no end. We gather in darkness to hear old stories of God's mercy and to remember that God became human like us in all things but sin, walked in our shoes and died for our salvation. We listen in darkness, and then, in a burst of glorious celebration, in a bath of light, we sing Alleluia! YES! He lives! YES! He is with us still! And on this night, this holiest of nights, we baptize and accept into the Church those who wish to become one with us at the Table of the Lord. We rejoice in the promise fulfilled, in the hope that has become reality.
