### Lifted Up!

*At the end of His earthly life Jesus ascends triumphantly into heaven. The Church acclaims Him in His holy humanity, invited to sit on the Father's right hand and to share His glory. But Christ's Ascension is the pledge of our own ascension. Filled with an immense hope, the Church looks up towards Christ, our leader, who precedes us into the heavenly home and takes us with Him in His own person: "for the Son of God, after incorporating in Himself those whom the devil's jealousy had banished from the earthly paradise, ascends again to His Father and takes them with Him" (St. Leo).*

*In St. Peter's Square last Sunday, speaking of the impending celebration of the Ascension, Pope Benedict XVI said, "The meaning of this last gesture of Jesus is twofold. Above all, ascending on 'high,' he unequivocally reveals his divinity: He returns to where he came from, that is, to God, after having fulfilled his mission on earth. Moreover, Christ ascends to heaven with the humanity he had assumed and which has resurrected from the dead: That humanity is ours, transfigured, divinized, made eternal. The Ascension, therefore, reveals the 'supreme vocation' (Gaudium et Spes, no. 22) of every human person -- called to the eternal life of the kingdom of God, kingdom of love, light and peace."*

*The celebration of Ascension of the Lord many believe dates back to apostolic times and has traditionally been celebrated on the 40th day of Easter, Thursday of the Sixth Week of Easter. However, in most of the provinces of the U.S. the celebration of the Solemnity of the Ascension has been transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter.*

#### **Mixed Emotions**

*Besides the hope and the joyful expectancy of heaven so characteristic of the Ascension feast there is a note of melancholy. Before the final departure of Jesus, the Apostles must have been very much disturbed: each felt the distress of one who sees his dearest friend and companion going away forever, and finds himself alone to face all the difficulties of life.*

*The Lord realized their state of mind and consoled them once more, promising the coming of the Holy Spirit, the Comforter: "He commanded them," we read in the Acts, "that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but should wait for the promise of the Father... you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit, not many days hence." But even this time the Apostles did not understand! How much they needed to be enlightened and transformed by the Holy Spirit, in order to accomplish the great mission which was to be entrusted to them!*

*Jesus continued "You shall receive the power of the Holy Spirit coming upon you and you shall be witnesses unto Me ... even to the uttermost part of the earth." For the moment, however, they were there, around the Master, weak, timid, frightened, like little children watching their mother leave for a distant, unknown land. In fact, "while they looked on, He was raised up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight." Two angels came to distract them from their great amazement and to make them realize what had happened. Then, placing their trust in the word of Jesus, which would henceforth be their only support, they returned to Jerusalem where, in the Cenacle, they awaited in prayer the fulfillment of the promise.*

#### **Preparing for Pentecost**

*This period of waiting became the first novena in preparation for Pentecost: "All these were persevering with one mind in prayer with ... Mary, the Mother of Jesus" (Acts 1:14), a novena that continues to this day. Silence, recollection, prayer, peace with our brethren, and union with Mary are the characteristics of the novena we too should make in preparation for the coming of the Holy Spirit.*

*In these times of difficulty, the promise of the Ascension and the anticipation of Pentecost are sources of strength and perseverance for the people of God. For two thousand years, the Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church has valiantly persisted by the grace of God the Father and the power of the Holy Spirit in the Most Holy Name of Jesus. For two thousand years, the Catholic Church has proclaimed the Good News to the whole creation, generation after generation. For two thousands years, the Ascension of the Lord has been commemorated in thoughts, in words and in actions.*

#### **Commissioning**

*As we reflect on the Ascension of the Lord Jesus during the coming week, we remember that while Jesus has ascended into Heaven, He is here with us today. He is present in our hearts. He is present in His apostolic Church. He is present in the Word. He is physically present in the Holy Eucharist. As mysterious as it seems, while Jesus Christ has ascended, our faith affirms to us that He is still here with us.*

*May the Lord continue to be with each and every one of you as you are moved by the Holy Spirit to accept the commissioning of the Ascension and proclaim the Good News to those around you.*

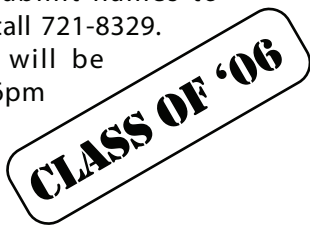

#### **HEALTH MINISTRY NEWS**

Health Ministry has invited Ms. Laurie Simons of InfoLine Sacramento to share her knowledge and expertise in the area of resources and referrals with us. InfoLine Sacramento is a valuable Community agency which provides comprehensive information and referral services to over 2400 agencies in the Sacramento region. #### **SUMMER IS JUST AROUND THE CORNER!**

Now is a good time to review a few simple healthful precautions before the temperature soars:

- 1. Protect yourself from the West Nile Virus! Apply an insect repellent with DEET. In addition, if you are out in the dawn or dusk hours of the day, wear long sleeved shirts and pants (with a tight weave fabric) when working in the yard, camping or hiking, etc. Empty containers filled with standing water to avoid mosquito breeding sites. An inch of standing water is an invitation to the mosquito population to set up housekeeping. Repair window and door screens to prevent mosquitoes from invading your homes.*
- 2. Protect your skin from sunburn. Apply a sun block lotion or cream with a UV rating of 15 or higher. Read the instructions carefully. The lotion will need to be reapplied after swimming or extended periods of exposure to the sun. Wear a wide brimmed hat to protect your head, ears and neck from excessive sun exposure when participating in outdoor activities. Protect your eyes from bright sunlight with quality UV protective sunglasses. Blue eyed people are more sensitive to light and should protect their eyes from bright sunlight.*
- 3. Keep yourself hydrated. Our bodies need 6-8 glasses of water each day (unless otherwise instructed by your doctor). Summer heat increases water loss through the skin-- perspiration. Consumption of alcohol and caffeinated beverages can also cause dehydration. Combined with the summer heat and excessive physical activity, it is essential to replace the fluid. WATER is an effective and inexpensive choice.*
- 4. Swimming pool owners, check to see that your pool is secure and safe from adventurous youngsters. Check for loose fence boards, non-working gate latches, etc. Parents, swimming lessons given in toddler years can prevent years of heartbreak because of a drowning accident. Children slip into the water SO QUIETLY! Life preserver wear can be purchased for toddlers.*
- 5. Treat yourself to a mini vacation at home. Set aside some ALONE time. A few minutes or an hour each day spent enjoying the quiet beauty of nature, reading and thoughtfully meditating on a passage from the Bible or just giving thanks to the Lord for all the wonderful things He has provided for your enjoyment will refresh your body and spirit. PEACE!*
