Introducing our Newest Family Member, Fr. Ron Marcelo

Last week we announced the arrival of Fr. Jeronimo "Ron" Marcelo as the new Parochial Vicar at Holy Family Church. As Fr. Ron participates fully in the daily life of the parish family, you will get to know him and become more and more familiar with his wonderful spirit and his devotion to what he simply calls "the Gospel-like way of life" that is at the heart of his call to serve the people of God.

Today we would like to share a very brief introduction to his personal story, and in time through his taking part in parish life, his homilies and other opportunities, we will discover more about this loving, gentle, and intelligent servant of God and His people.

Fr. Ron was born in the Philippines, in the capital city of Manila, and, in his youth, moved with his family to Spain. There he was attracted to the Christian Community of Verbum Dei (Word of God) which helped to draw him fully into the life of the church and closer to God's call that he would ultimately answer. In their own words, "Verbum Dei's objective is to form apostles of Christ from among people of every state of life; regardless of gender, race and social condition," and their "specific and particular contribution to the Church is living and propagating the Kingdom of God through communities of evangelical life, which pray and teach others to pray."

Fr. Ron became an active member of the community, participating in Youth Ministry, including annual summer camping and hiking expeditions in the Alps and participation in International church youth events throughout Europe.

As a young man, Fr. Ron studied in Madrid and was ordained there. His first mission was University Chaplaincy in Madrid, after which he was assigned to Ireland and England where he served for three years.

His next home was Rome where he studied philosophy, theology and liturgy with the Benedictine community. After three years in Rome, his next mission was in Perugia, Italy, near Assisi, where he served for eight years.

While his dedication and missions were focused on administration in the church, he has always maintained heavy involvement with young people, including participation in all available youth encounters with Pope John Paul II throughout Europe. He now brings his experience, his commitment to Christ and to serving the people of God to the people of Holy Family Parish, especially the youth. We look forward with great anticipation to his sharing in our parish family life.

Fr. Ron espouses the commitment of Pope Benedict XVI to focus first on "the Goodness of Being Christian" and he believes the key to touching the hearts of the faithful, young and old, is to do all he can to create a "positive and joyful experience of church" for those he serves.

In addition to his homilies and our personal contact with our newest family member, from time to time Fr. Ron will be invited to share his experience, his vast knowledge and his indomitable spirit with us through this very column.

Welcome, Fr. Ron, to this beautiful, vibrant family.

HURRICANE RECOVERY CONTINUES

In June at the General Assembly of Bishops in Los Angeles, the bishops heard a report from the Hurricane Recovery Task Force as well as from several bishops still reeling from the catastrophic devastation caused by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

While the original national collection raised more than \$130,000,000, largely for humanitarian relief, the needs for diocesan recovery in the Archdiocese of New Orleans and the Diocese of Biloxi are as great now as they were immediately after the storms. In the Diocese of Biloxi the local Bishop reports that 428 of 433 Church-owned structures were destroyed or severely damaged, with more than \$70,000,000 damage sustained, and insurance will cover only \$35,000,000. In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, the Archbishop estimates \$52,000,000 in uninsured flood damages on buildings they are attempting to reopen right now, and another \$70,000,000 uninsured flood damage on buildings they have had to delay reopening. These costs place even greater burdens on people already overwhelmed by grief, dislocation and discouragement.

Such needs demand an immediate response. Therefore, the bishops' conference approved a second national collection for those two dioceses. The first collection focused on humanitarian relief. This collection is intended to help meet the Church's recovery and rebuilding needs. 60% of the collection will be provided to the Archdiocese of New Orleans and 40% to the Diocese of Biloxi. Holy Family will help in this effort with a second collection on the weekend of September 23rd & 24th,
