News from the All Ministry Get Together

Last weekend, the Holy Family Health Ministry hosted an All Ministry Get Together in St. Joseph Hall of the Community Center. Members of the dozens of ministries that serve Holy Family Parish were invited to meet each other, as well as to be introduced to the wonderful people who make up the newly formed Health Ministry Committee - a group formed to expand the services and the scope of the ministry. Health Ministry at Holy Family was founded 12 years ago by Clare Curran who, along with Clair Alway, continues to serve the parish by leading this vital ministry.

The purpose of the event was "to improve communication between the ministry family for more efficient service to the parish and the community." Each ministry member present was given the opportunity to introduce herself/himself and to share some information about their ministry, including the services they provide and their current needs. The great number of ministries that serve this community and the tremendous range of ways in which they serve are true testimony to the work of the Holy Spirit in this parish family.

In addition to the ministry sharing, the event served as the kickoff of a tremendous new effort by the Health Ministry to better understand and address the needs of the parish and community. The various ministry members at the gathering became the first to participate in the Holy Family Health Ministry Survey which you will be hearing much more about very soon. The Health Ministry Committee

has formulated a simple yet comprehensive survey to study the health needs and concerns of all parishioners. And, it was made very clear that the Health Ministry is interested in our complete well-being - physical, mental and spiritual health. The gathering of ministries was impressive, but there was one noticeable void in the assembly - most of our parishioners who serve in the ministry of Faith Formation were attending an all day program at St. Francis Church aimed at affirming and improving religious education in parishes of the Sacramento Diocese. These hard-working women and men are charged with a enormous responsibility - the building of a solid Catholic Christian foundation in the lives of our children and youth.

Today we celebrate Catechetical Sunday which is an opportunity to show our appreciation for those who serve in the ministry of catechists that is so vital to the life of the Church. Our responsibility as a parish church is to support parents in their role as the primary teachers of their families. Catechesis of children encompasses promoting knowledge of our faith, sacramental preparation for initiation, liturgical education, moral formation and prayer. Through our Faith Formation program, Holy Family seeks to give the children in our faith community the knowledge, experience, and skills necessary to become faithful and fruitful disciples of Jesus.

HURRICANE RECOVERY COLLECTION NEXT WEEKEND

In June at the General Assembly of Bishops in Los Angeles, the bishops heard a report from the Hurricane Recovery Task Force as well as from several bishops still reeling from the catastrophic devastation caused by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita.

While the original national collection raised more than \$130,000,000, largely for humanitarian relief, the needs for diocesan recovery in the Archdiocese of New Orleans and the Diocese of Biloxi are as great now as they were immediately after the storms. In the Diocese of Biloxi the local Bishop reports that 428 of 433 Church-owned structures were destroyed or severely damaged, with more than \$70,000,000 damage sustained, and insurance will cover only \$35,000,000. In the Archdiocese of New Orleans, the Archbishop estimates \$52,000,000 in uninsured flood damages on buildings they are attempting to reopen right now, and another \$70,000,000 uninsured flood damage on buildings they have had to delay reopening. These costs place even greater burdens on people already overwhelmed by grief, dislocation and discouragement.

Such needs demand an immediate response. Therefore, the bishops' conference approved a second national collection for those two dioceses. The first collection focused on humanitarian relief. This collection is intended to help meet the Church's recovery and rebuilding needs. 60% of the collection will be provided to the Archdiocese of New Orleans and 40% to the Diocese of Biloxi. Holy Family will help in this effort with a second collection on the weekend of September 23rd & 24th,
