### **News from the Finance Council**

*I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude for all your generosity over the first six months of this fiscal year. Thank you also for the wonderful Christmas collection which was almost the same as last year's. I would also like to thank the parishioners who make up the Parish Finance Council for their hard work and commitment to the fiscal health of our beloved Holy Family Parish.*

*At their November 28th meeting, the Council reviewed the Parish Financial Report that was distributed to all parishioners in October, 2006. The Council looked at how the Legacy Appeal is going and also at the last year of the Capital Campaign for the diocese. The Council finds this a good time both to thank you for all you've done and to ask for your assistance through the next six months.*

*It will be great if you can stay strong on the Capital Campaign which ends this year in June. If we have a shortfall on this, it will have to be made up to the diocese from general parish funds.*

*The Legacy Restoration Appeal is a good way to support Holy Family. We have now completed the first year of this program, and it has been a good year. God bless all those currently involved in Legacy, and we invite all those not yet involved to become active in the appeal. We will offer information as to how to get involved in Legacy in next week's bulletin.*

*There is so much good going on in Holy Family Parish - our Catholic school, the religious classes for children not in our school, the prayer life of the parish, the excellent youth ministry, the fine programs for those who speak Spanish and now our retired priest, Fr. John Sullivan, ministering here are all a great boost.*

*However, there is some concern, and the Finance Council and I ask your help with this. We are now half way through the fiscal year and, as of today, are at just 92% of the goal for the year in general collections. We hoped to have received \$297,000 at this time but have only received \$274,000. With half of the year left we can still catch up, but it will take everyone making a great effort. Can you please help? In order to make it easier for all of us, I have accepted the Council's advice that the goal for next fiscal year, 2007-2008, will remain the same as for this fiscal year. If we can reach our goal this year we will then be in good shape for the following year, as well.*

*To make this happen, each person or family would need to decide today to make a change, to increase their weekly donation. Please consider what you will do. Can you increase by \$20...\$15...\$10...or \$5 per Sunday? A small increase from each contributor will add up to a significant increase on the whole, and that would be terrific.*

*The parish hopes soon to provide the opportunity, as some have requested, to transfer funds electronically to the parish. We will also, this year, provide information to all parishioners on how you can remember the parish and school in your Will as we promote a Parish Foundation Plan.*

*Thank you for all you do so generously for this great parish. Members of the Finance Council are parishioners just like you and can assure you that every penny is spent as wisely as possible, accounted for in a complete and transparent way, and reports are provided to all parishioners and the Bishop.*

*What is needed now - what is asked - is that you make a choice today for next Sunday's collection to make whatever increase you can. May God bless you in this decision and reward you for all your continued generosity.*

*May you have a blessed New Year of health, happiness, prosperity and joy in our Blessed Lord, Jesus Christ. On behalf of the Finance Council and myself, thank you, again, for all you do so generously.*

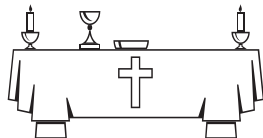

### Auxiliary Bishop Richard J. Garcia Named Bishop of Monterey

Pope Benedict XVI has named Bishop Garcia to succeed Bishop Sylvester Ryan as bishop of Monterey.



Bishop Garcia has served as auxiliary bishop of Sacramento for the past nine years. He is also Moderator of the Curia for the Diocese and Vicar for Hispanics and Other Ethnic Ministries.

During his ministry among us, Bishop Garcia brought a strong pastoral commitment to Catholic schools, Spanish-speaking Catholics, new immigrants, migrant workers, youth, and inmates in state prisons. He traveled continually to parishes throughout the 20-county diocese, which stretches from Solano County to the Oregon border and east to Nevada.

Bishop Garcia will be installed as the fourth bishop of Monterey during a Mass in Monterey on January 30, 2007. The Diocese of Monterey encompasses 46 parishes and 18 schools in the four Central Coast counties of Monterey, Santa Cruz, San Benito, and San Luis Obispo. Bishop Garcia is truly a credit to the Church.

We are happy for the Diocese of Monterey, but we are sad to see him leave the Diocese of Sacramento. There will be two farewell Masses and receptions for Bishop Garcia on Sunday, January 21 at 1:00 p.m. at St. Joseph Church, Redding and on Sunday, January 28 at 2:30 p.m. at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. All are welcome to attend.

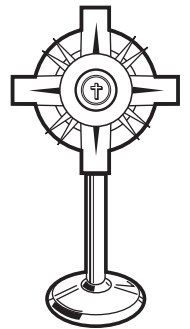


### **VOCATIONS CROSS**

## **PREVENT A STROKE IN AS LITTLE AS 10 MINUTES**

Life Line Screening will be performing a day of preventive health screenings at Citrus Heights Community Church on Wednesday, February 7, 2007.

The tests offered include a state of the art ultrasound screening of the carotid arteries in the neck (most strokes are linked to plaque build-up in these arteries), another ultrasound screening of the abdominal aortic aneurysm (ruptured AAA's have a 85-94% mortality rate and present little or no signs), a third test which screens for plaque build-up in the arteries of the legs (a strong indicator of coronary heart disease) and a fourth bone density test which screens for signs of osteoporosis.

"Why not just go to my doctor for these tests?" you may ask. The answer, although surprising, is that your physician typically cannot order these tests without clear evidence of symptoms. Ironically, most people who suffer a stroke or abdominal aneurysm never show any signs that a major medical catastrophe is about to occur.

These painless, non-invasive tests take about 10 minutes each and are offered for just \$45 each (all four for \$129). YOU MUST PRE-REGISTER by calling 1-800-324-1851.
