### **Revisiting Legacy - A Restoration Appeal for Holy Family Parish**

*A little more than a year ago, we initiated the Legacy Restoration Appeal, a "Voluntary Commitment" program designed to utilize the power of volume commitment at comfortable, lower giving levels. Simply put, a small amount from all families in the parish adds up to a great contribution. Fuller participation is the key to the success of this program.*

*This Appeal was created to provide funding to complete maintenance and repair projects, upgrade our parish facilities and retire debt - specifically the balance of the existing loan on the Community Center. This program is based on numbers born out of first-hand experience, real debt assessment and homegrown, "family" solutions to "family" needs.*

*The history of this parish is built on the love and generosity of the people of Holy Family. It is essential that we recognize and express our tremendous gratitude to those who contributed generously to the original Community Center campaign and those who have supported and continue to support the diocesan Capital Campaign and those who have been active in this Legacy Appeal to date. Your commitment and generosity have brought us this far, and your benevolence has carved a path for growth through stewardship that will be an example to your parish family for years to come.*

*The details of Legacy were spelled out in the beginning over three weeks of talks by lay leaders and myself at weekend Masses. Parish family members were given the opportunity without demand and without pressure to make their pledge if they choose to do so at the time though it has been left open to later pledges for people with special circumstances and new arrivals to the parish.*

*The goal is for our parish to finish this appeal secure in the knowledge that every parishioner has been invited to assist in the financial transformation of the parish. Everyone is valued, and each has only to do his or her fair share. There has been no "hard sell," no home visit, no tough talks either personally or as groups. This appeal to a modest goal is completely different from anything we have undertaken in the past.*

*Holy Family School families, parishioners and non-parishioners alike, continue to be a major part of our progress as they have been asked to share fully in this appeal. We are truly blessed that while Holy Family School is the largest in the diocese, it continues to flourish without financial impact on the parish. While most parishes have to deal with the reality of supporting school funding and maintaining school facilities, Sister Arlene Connelly and the wonderful parents and staff of Holy Family School have built and maintained their facilities, bolstered their academic excellence and provided for continued growth on their own, without placing any burden or debt on the parish. This is a rare and remarkable feat and one for which we are immeasurably grateful.*

*The "Legacy" campaign is focused on a flat-rate "assessment" amount based on the individual family's ability to give on a monthly basis. (The full amount of the gift can certainly be "paid" up front or given in installments of any frequency - monthly, quarterly or annually - so long as the fair share commitment is realized.) Monthly campaign envelopes continue to be distributed as circumstances may have changed for the individual family, and they may find themselves in the position to start contributing or make additional contributions. The campaign materials and envelopes will be distributed to new families that register in the parish with the understanding that such stewardship is a regular part of parish life and not an extraordinary measure. Our parishioners have shown in the past two years that they have a great understanding of the depth of our need and have done an amazing job on stewardship in the life of the parish.*

*Many of the originally stated objectives of Legacy have already been addressed or are under way, while some are still on the horizon:*

- o Retirement of Community Center Debt (in progress)*
- o Interior and Exterior Church repair/restoration (stained glass, plumbing, paint, floor work, etc.)*
- o Church air conditioning system repair, upgrade and upkeep (first phase completed)*
- o Parking lot resurfacing and re-striping (first phase completed)*
- o Parish Office repairs - electrical, plumbing, telephones, restructuring office space, updating computers (in progress)*
- o Community Center repair/improvement - floor, roof, lighting (in progress)*
- o Repairs to other Parish buildings*
- o Landscaping, signs, plant beautification*

*I hope you continue to do your best on this appeal and together we build up Holy Family Parish. I personally ask for your support. Please pray over your commitment and participate as God puts it in your heart. I am always glad to receive your commitment personally and hear your thoughts on the life of our parish. Thank you, again, for your tremendous generosity.*

### Auxiliary Bishop Richard J. Garcia Named Bishop of Monterey

Pope Benedict XVI has named Bishop Garcia to succeed Bishop Sylvester Ryan as bishop of Monterey.

Bishop Garcia has served as auxiliary bishop of Sacramento for the past nine years. He is also Moderator of the Curia for the Diocese and Vicar for Hispanics and Other Ethnic Ministries.



During his ministry among us, Bishop Garcia brought a strong pastoral commitment to Catholic schools, Spanish-speaking Catholics, new immigrants, migrant workers, youth, and inmates in state prisons. He traveled continually to parishes throughout the 20-county diocese, which stretches from Solano County to the Oregon border and east to Nevada.

Bishop Garcia will be installed as the fourth bishop of Monterey during a Mass in Monterey on January 30, 2007. The Diocese of Monterey encompasses 46 parishes and 18 schools in the four Central Coast counties of Monterey, Santa Cruz, San Benito, and San Luis Obispo. Bishop Garcia is truly a credit to the Church.

We are happy for the Diocese of Monterey, but we are sad to see him leave the Diocese of Sacramento. There will be two farewell Masses and receptions for Bishop Garcia on Sunday, January 21 at 1:00 p.m. at St. Joseph Church, Redding and on Sunday, January 28 at 2:30 p.m. at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. All are welcome to attend.

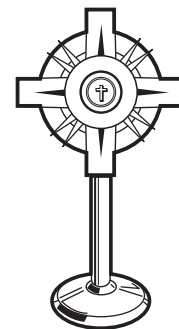
### VOCATIONS CROSS

## **PREVENT A STROKE IN AS LITTLE AS 10 MINUTES**

Life Line Screening will be performing a day of preventive health screenings at Citrus Heights Community Church on Wednesday, February 7, 2007.

The tests offered include a state of the art ultrasound screening of the carotid arteries in the neck (most strokes are linked to plaque build-up in these arteries), another ultrasound screening of the abdominal aortic aneurysm (ruptured AAA's have a 85-94% mortality rate and present little or no signs), a third test which screens for plaque build-up in the arteries of the legs (a strong indicator of coronary heart disease) and a fourth bone density test which screens for signs of osteoporosis.

"Why not just go to my doctor for these tests?" you may ask. The answer, although surprising, is that your physician typically cannot order these tests without clear evidence of symptoms. Ironically, most people who suffer a stroke or abdominal aneurysm never show any signs that a major medical catastrophe is about to occur.

These painless, non-invasive tests take about 10 minutes each and are offered for just \$45 each (all four for \$129). YOU MUST PRE-REGISTER by calling 1-800-324-1851.
