#### COME CELEBRATE THE HOLY FAMILY PARISH MISSION

As you have heard and read over the past two weeks, part of our Lenten Journey will be celebrating the Holy Family Parish Mission this week, Monday, February 26 through Thursday, March 1, featuring day and evening sessions.

A parish mission is a special event in the life of a parish. It is a coming together of all the parishioners. It is a time when we gather to reflect on our lives in the light of the Gospel, a time to pray as a community and a time to celebrate our faith in Jesus as our Lord and Savior. It is a time when God moves among His people in a very special way – a moment of grace, a time when we meet our Lord Jesus in a new and different way. It is a time of prayer, a time set aside to reflect on our life and our relationship with God and others. It is a time for the “faith batteries” of the parish community to be re-charged and for all people to be re-awakened in faith and to be newly fired by the Holy Spirit.

It is a time to clear your calendars and join with your parish family, affirming our common faith and learning to live it every day. I encourage you to make room in your schedule for our Parish Mission and room in your hearts for the fruits of this celebration of the love of God in our lives.

It is so easy to drift along in life while forgetting about its real purpose. It's so easy to get caught up in the anxieties and concerns of this life without proper thought for the life that lasts forever. The Parish Mission is an extremely important time in our life because it helps us do just this. During a Parish Mission, peace and joy can be rediscovered in our lives.

#### **Mission Theme**

In last week's bulletin, “Conversion” was given as the theme of the Parish Mission. Many people have a strict notion of

“conversion” as just an official change of religious affiliation or a wholesale change in one's beliefs. The “Conversion” we will discuss this week is something different – an event that results in a transformation, a spiritual enlightenment causing one to lead a new life. Conversion is a moral change, a turning or returning to God – the turn away from sin to a life of virtue. This life conversion is our acceptance and use of God's gifts of reason and faith to arrive at a genuine knowledge of the existence of one true God, our Creator and Lord. Conversion is a cycle – it begins with a seed of faith, which inspires an act of our intellect and will, which brings us to a better understanding of what God has revealed to us – leading right back to deeper faith. We are converted when, by the influence of divine grace in our souls, our whole life is changed – old things pass away, and all things become new.

God, Our Father, we offer you praise and thanksgiving for the many gifts You have given us through Jesus, your Son. We thank you especially for the gift of our parish Mission.

Jesus, Lord, open our hearts to the experience of the Mission.

Open our hearts to listen to your Word.

Bring us closer to you and to one another.

Grant, most Holy Spirit, that our Mission may bring down your richest blessing on each and every member of our parish community.

Heavenly Father, we pray through the intercession of Mary, our Mother, in the name of Jesus Christ who lives with you and the Holy Spirit forever. Amen

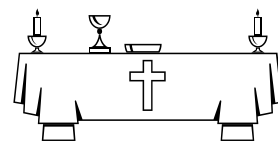

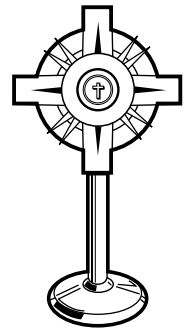
### VOCATIONS CROSS
