## ANSWERING GOD'S CALL

*It is rare that I have a copy of my homily but in response to some who asked I share my thoughts on last Sunday's readings.*

*In these scriptures everything we hear is about a call. Elijah, following God's command, calls Elisha to follow him. Paul calls the Galatians to be free in Christ and guided by the Spirit. And Jesus calls disciples. In each case - Elisha, the Galatians, and unnamed disciples - all are not only called but are challenged. It isn't any different for us today. We are called, and answering the call has its difficulties - and its rewards.*

*What we are called to, as those early disciples were called to, is to follow Jesus. Like Elisha with Elijah we are called to serve Jesus. Like the Galatians we are called to serve one another through love. And as followers of Jesus we are called to an exclusive dedication to Jesus, to be faithful each day of our Christian life.*

*We might think that Elisha's response was a little extreme. He wanted to kiss his father and mother goodbye, but instead he slaughtered the twelve yoke of oxen and used his plowing equipment to boil their flesh so that he could give the meat to his people. That is dedication, and Elisha accepted it freely and without hesitation - and he did it on his own initiative.*

*Jesus' responses to the would-be disciples might seem even harsher. "Let the dead bury their dead." And "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." We don't know how those would-be disciples reacted to Jesus' words. The exclusive dedication Jesus is calling for is obvious. It sounds like now or never, no second thoughts.*

*Mother Teresa might help us to understand this kind of dedication. We all know how much she did for Jesus through his suffering people - our sisters and brothers. Someone once asked her if she didn't think that what she did was a mere drop in the bucket. Her response is classic: "No; it is a mere drop in the ocean - but if I didn't do it, it might not be done at all." Then when someone else said, "But there is so much to do; how can we even begin?" Mother Teresa replied, "We can't do everything, so don't worry about that.*

*All we can do is what is right in front of us right now, and that we must do."*

*Mother Teresa has it right, and so does Elisha. He didn't hesitate to follow Elijah. In a sense, Paul is telling the Galatians the same thing. They were called for freedom and in that freedom they were to serve one another in love and not to be distracted from their calling. They were to do what was right in front of them that needed doing. Jesus' would-be disciples were given the same choice. They could do what needed doing or they could put it off, though at what cost!*

*And that leaves us. How are we, each of us and all of us together, being called today? How are we being asked to live faithfully each day? What must we renounce and accept freely? What do I, what do you, and what do we need to do right now? How are we to serve in love.*

*Those are heavy questions, but they should not discourage us. The Responsorial Psalm tells us why: "You are my inheritance, O Lord." That means when Jesus calls us to follow him he is right there by our side. He is walking with us all the way. If we think he is asking too much, think of what his Father asked of him. Think of his promise of the Holy Spirit to guide us. God will not ask us to do what we are not able to do and Jesus teaches us the way.*

Here I am, Lord,  
I come  
to do your will.

*Like Elisha we are called to be prophets who see with the eyes of God. Jesus calls us to be conformed to himself. St. Paul says "have that mind in you that is in Christ Jesus." Jesus asks us to live with our families, at work, at school, in our community, seeing with the eyes of God - seeing what is right in front of us that needs doing in God's service. We are all called to this. You are; I am; we all are together. Today's Alleluia verse gives us an appropriate prayer: "Speak, Lord, your servant is listening."*

*I suggest to you that we all use the following three prayers each day, indeed several times a day: "You are my inheritance o Lord"; "Speak Lord your servant is listening"; "Here I am Lord, I come to do your will."*

*God bless you with peace, joy, and service in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ - to Him be glory and praise forever.*

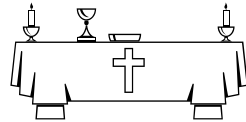

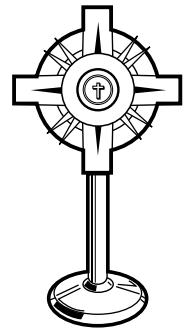


## **VOCATIONS CROSS**
