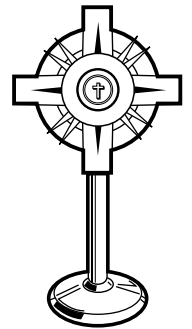
### **VOCATIONS CROSS**
