Things to Keep

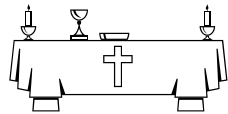

Recent legislation allows donors age 70 1/2 or older to make gifts to Catholic Relief Services using funds transferred directly from their IRA without paying taxes on the distribution. This manner of giving is in effect until December 31, 2007.

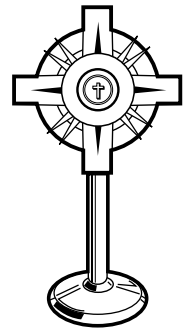
VOCATIONS CROSS
