† Servant Leader † GOSPEL REFLECTIONS

As I prepare for the Sunday Servant Leader bulletin article, I look at ways to help people with their faith. Beginning next Sunday, you will find a series of articles over a dozen Sundays (not necessarily consecutive) on a number of topics which I hope you find interesting. There may be breaks in these as we go through the holidays and special articles must be presented. Today, I offer a simple reflection on three Gospel situations. 1) the humility of the Centurion, (2) The raising of Lazarus, and 3) faith in our secular society.

1) The Humility of the Centurion. The humility of the centurion in the gospel teaches a lesson to all of us. It is simply this: even though we may not know too much about God and therefore have difficulty in saying that we "love God above all" as Jesus commanded, if we humbly admit our unworthiness to ask for special favors, God will take it from there. Humility is the key that opens up the door of our heart to the grace of God. The centurion's faith was a faith in a yet unknown God whose power he discerned radiating from this man, Jesus, whom his Jewish friends had recommended to him. He was not a Jew himself but he respected his friends' belief in God. This openness to belief was in itself a sign of his humility. He knew that he did not know and he opened his mind to knowing more. Without believing in Jesus as God, he did believe that Jesus could do something for his daughter. He humbly felt unworthy that Jesus should come to his house. He did not know that Jesus had already come into his heart, planting there the seed of a new amazing faith.

2) Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead. In the gospel we read the story of one of the first times that Jesus brought a dead person back to life. We don't know if he wept on this occasion. We know that later on, as he stood by the grave of Lazarus, he did weep. It is likely that he was tempted to weep whenever he saw human misery. Of course he knew that those we call "dead" are truly alive and that in the future they will rise again. But even this consoling knowledge did not overcome the sympathy he felt for the sadness of those who were left behind. It was this sympathy that prompted him on this occasion to bring the dead boy back to life and return him to the arms of this mother. Later on, as he passed the cemetery containing all those who had not been brought back to life, he said to the crowd, "What I did for this widow is not the usual way I conquer death. I brought her boy back to life but someday he will die again. The true answer to death is for every human to die in the living arms of God. Then they will be assured of being with their loved ones for all eternity."

3) Faith in our secular society. The gospel points out a danger that we Christians have always faced, but perhaps even more so in our present secular society. It is the danger of being so embarrassed at being a Christian that we hide our faith "under our bed." We are not often challenged to proclaim our faith in Jesus by grand speeches but we are often challenged to proclaim our love for Christ by our actions. It is not likely that most of us will ever face death because of our faith. We are more likely to be threatened with ridicule or exclusion from the group that has defined itself as the IN crowd. Thus a business person may be told that if they will not cut corners they will not get ahead. College students will be excluded from a fraternity/sorority because they refuse to get drunk or be promiscuous. In polite circles a person may be looked at with disdain if they dare to bring up the subject of religion. In today's gospel Christ warns that from those to whom much has been given, much will be demanded. We have been given the Christian faith. At the very least we should not hide it when the occasion demands that we stand up for it.
