## THREE GLORIOUS EVENTS IN THE EASTER SEASON

*A couple of weeks ago I told you of my travel plans as I had the privilege of attending three important events in the life of the church during the period April 14-24.*

*First, I attended the National Workshop on Christian Unity (NWCU) in Chicago, Illinois April 14-17th. The local Catholic hosts and the ecumenical and interreligious staff in the Archdiocese of Chicago put together a fine program to promote Christian unity.*

*Over the course of the event we heard from many excellent speakers including Rabbi Herman Schaalman, past chief rabbi for the Rabbinical Council of Chicago who gave an excellent talk on relations today between Catholics and Jews. The Eucharist was held with Ukrainian Bishop Richard S. Seminack presiding and Archdiocesan Auxiliary Bishop Thad J. Jakubowski preaching.*

*There were many new ecumenical and interreligious officers and others who participated in the NWCU and CADEIO programs for the very first time presenting a number of insightful and important workshops.*

*The second part of the trip was the magnificent opportunity to celebrate Mass in St. Patrick's Cathedral with our Holy Father Pope Benedict the XVI and 2,500 Bishops, Priests, Sisters and Deacons. This was a great blessing for all involved and spiritually uplifting as well as educational. I have the most joyful memories of this Mass...the waiting for it to start, the excitement as the Pope entered first and then came out vested. The enrichment of seeing the Vicar of Christ there in his presidential chair, the eloquence and challenge of his life-giving words, the spirit of faith in the congregation, the joyful music of the overall splendid liturgy, and the rapturous procession at the end of the Mass.*

*This encounter with the Holy Father inspires me to share some thoughts with you on his entire visit to the United States.*

*Pope Benedict's visit can be a New Pentecost. A lot of what this visit could mean to the U.S. church was missed by dioceses before he came. People are looking for community, and something spiritually genuine that can interact with the new generation. They are open but confused and need to be fed. For Pope Benedict there is huge energy and joy in his visit.*

*It was a pity his visit was restricted by security. He could have received five times the crowds, if allowed. Everything went off perfectly and could not have been better. We must use the media more to widen both the audience Christ touches through the Holy Father and the substance of the message. A hidden line in the Pope's visit was immigration.*

*The Holy Father knows we need a united presbyterate and a united Church. We must reach out to people we have*

*not always agreed with. A split of 51-49% is not the goal – we must strive for all the people in the Church. We can't let bad news get us down, and we must not let the skeptics annoy or destroy us. 99% of what we do in Church is wonderful. The Church must work together as a cohesive whole, and things will flourish, vocations increase and people will join if we work as a complete entity.*

*For the Pope's visit, the emphasis was different than in past visits and other gatherings. In the past the focus was negative, but this time positive. The faith is growing so much – 2,000 new faithful were brought into Church at Easter in Dallas alone. People come to Benedict for the message and want to be called to responsibility. The young are inspired to step in to do the work of Christ.*

*The third section of the trip was Emerging Models of Pastoral Leadership, a National Ministry Summit held in Orlando, Florida. There were dynamic presentations, interpretation of the latest research, probing conversations, theological reflections, and vibrant prayer and liturgies. For the past four years the Emerging Models of Pastoral Leadership Project hosted a national conversation for today's pastoral leaders. More than 700 creative and dedicated men and women gathered in locations around the country to discuss evolving leadership roles and parish structures. Bishops met in focus groups, lay and ordained pastoral leaders responded to surveys and young adult leaders contacted online. Findings were studied and analyzed and implications named. Pastoral leaders identified the trends, challenges, and growth edges of pastoral leadership. Collectively, from these we can anticipate a future filled with hope.*

*The scope of this research is deep and wide-ranging looking at the evolving role of pastoral leaders, lay and ordained, who are caring for God's people in the midst of significant transitions in parish life. The goal of the National Ministry Summit is to engage participants in discussion on Project findings; developing recommendations for the future; sharing models and best practices; and, celebrating the work of the Emerging Models Project. Experiences, thoughts and wisdom were shared in interactive settings among attendees. People came prepared by reading online summaries of Project findings in six specific areas of research. Participants met and interacted with others who share similar passions for being a disciple and follower of Jesus.*

*Just as in Chicago the previous week, this event was filled with wonderful speakers and presentations. Action Group Sessions spotlighted issues that impact parishes and parish pastoral leadership. This was an opportunity to engage*

## NEXT SUNDAY – PENTECOST

On Pentecost we celebrate the day on which the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples in a form resembling tongues of fire, empowering them to proclaim the message that Jesus is risen from the dead. According to Acts of the Apostles (1:13-14), Mary, the apostles, and other disciples had been huddled together in an upper room after the ascension of Jesus. But on this day they went forth from that room as new people, alive in the Spirit, speaking in tongues and winning over believers by the thousands.

The Mass of Pentecost Sunday is marked by a few special features. The first reading for Saturday's Vigil Mass, for example, is taken from the Old Testament. Throughout the Easter season, all the readings come from the New Testament - except, of course, the responsorial psalm. Saturday's first reading foreshadows the coming of the Spirit. On Sunday the first reading comes from Acts of the Apostles, and it tells the story of Pentecost. After the second reading, everyone sings or says the Pentecost sequence, a special hymn that tells the meaning of this day.



If the priest uses Eucharistic Prayer 1, he inserts a special phrase saying that this is the day on which the Holy Spirit appeared to the apostles. The Mass concludes with a double "alleluia." The deacon or priest adds the words to his dismissal, and you answer, "Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia." This joyful acclamation concludes the church's celebration of Easter.

The paschal candle burns throughout the Pentecost Mass, as it does for the 50 days of the Easter season. After Mass, however, it is moved from its place near the ambo to a position in the baptistry.

*in conversation with peers on research about everything from multi-parish pastoring to multicultural reality, and more! We participated in developing implications and recommendations for the future direction of providing pastoral leadership. Action Group facilitators offered analysis and participants delved into the research in small group discussions and large group sharing. We offered our thoughts and insights about the research and identified specific proposals for the continuing development of pastoral leadership in the future.*

*Most Rev. Thomas Wenski presided at Eucharist on the opening day with the Most Reverend Blase J. Cupich, Bishop of Rapid City, presiding at the beautiful closing Mass. Due to great interest in this topic, it was necessary to enlarge the space and over 1,200 people attended.*

*All in all, there were three events that greatly enriched the Church in the United States.*

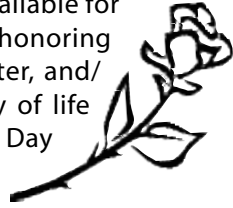
