YEAR OF ST. PAUL

The Holy Father has designated June 28, 2008-June 29, 2009 as the **Year of St. Paul**. This will be a celebration of the Second Millennium of St. Paul's birth. From a persecutor of the early Christians, Saint Paul was changed forever when he met Christ on the way to Damascus. Although he was not one of the original twelve apostles, he became known as the "thirteenth apostle." He traveled great distances, preaching and writing as he went along, to bring the Gospel of Jesus to everyone. His great love for the Lord and for all people will inspire many people to follow.

The spirit of St. Paul took root and enflamed the hearts of men and women who embraced an apostolic ideal, which gave rise to unlimited generosity. The Apostle Paul was a great communicator and an intense writer. Reading and reflecting on the complete text of St. Paul's letters is the best way to gain a true experience of his passionate spirit and persuasive words. This year, the bi-millennial celebration of his birth, would be a great time for individual parish groups to study the Letters of St. Paul.

The early Christian communities with whom Paul had shared his life and preaching, anticipated receiving a letter from him, and they found courage, guidance, and consolation in his words. These same letters, in fact, have been central to the Church's teachings throughout the centuries and to the present day. With a little personal preparation (be sure to read the introductions) and reflection (contemplate their meaning for you) these letters can speak to our own needs today just as they have for Christians down through the ages. Let the life and words of the Apostle Paul enliven your heart and stir up your relationship with God so that, like for Paul, Jesus Christ will truly be the Lord of your life. You may find the following prayers of help:

Praying with St. Paul the Apostle. Blessed are you, God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens (Eph 1-3). Make us always ready to proclaim to all the boundless riches of Christ and to throw light on the inner workings of the mystery kept hidden through the ages in God, in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord (Eph). Glory to you, Father, whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine; glory to you from generation to generation in the Church and in Christ Jesus forever and ever (Eph xx) Amen.

Prayer to St. Paul for our Nation. St. Paul, watch over with love, this nation and its people. Your heart expanded so as to welcome and enfold all peoples in the loving embrace of peace. Now, from Heaven may the charity of Christ urge

you to enlighten everyone with the light of the Gospel, and to establish the kingdom of love. May this nation find in Christ the Way and the Truth and the Life. May its light shine before the world, and may it always seek the kingdom of God and his justice. Holy Apostle, enlighten, comfort and bless us all. Amen.

Prayer to Follow One's Vocation. St. Paul, you traveled the world, never quite knowing where the Spirit would lead you next. You journeyed in faith and accepted beatings, imprisonment, shipwreck, and ultimately execution because of your faith in Jesus Christ. Help me to accept the great adventure of leading a life faithful to the words of Jesus my Master, the Way, the Truth and the Life. May I ask myself, "Where does God want me to go today?" On the journey, may I love in the way you taught the Corinthians (1 Cor. 15), and be willing to endure all things for the sake of the Gospel. Pray with me, that I may heed the voice of the One who called you on the road to Damascus, and set you on the path that leads to life. Amen.

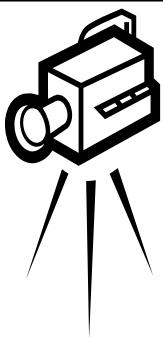
