EXPERIENCING THE MASS

Often people ask questions about the Mass, so I am glad to provide this article which may be of help. It was written in the Marist Messenger Magazine, by Fr. John Kelly.

Nowadays parents often tell me that a common complaint among young people is that the mass is boring. Unfortunately many give up religious practice because it no longer gives them an emotional uplift. Perhaps some go to another church where one's feelings are better catered for.

This raises the whole question as to what is the role of feelings in our Christian life? It is often pointed out that we are not pure spirits but creatures of flesh and blood and emotions. Consequently our workshop of God is not expected to be a pure act of will but also involves our body, mind and feelings. Our worship should be that of the whole person, not a purely spiritual worship. In the liturgy we use not just our wills but music, song and even dance that call into play other dimensions of the human person. Furthermore our churches and altars are places of beauty that lift us up to God. The church does her best to provide a liturgy that will evoke a total personal response of body, mind and heart from all the participants. She insists on good music and good art and hopes to make of the liturgy an enjoyable experience. She certainly does not want people to be bored.

But is may be asked, has our prayer any value if we do not find the liturgy an enjoyable experience? Perhaps we are slightly indisposed, distracted, or we may have little appreciation of art or music. Again we may find that the liturgy is not to our liking for one reason or another. The sermon may not be very inspiring. There can be a thousand different reasons why we do not always experience a spiritual 'high' at the liturgy. Does this mean that our participation is without value? This raises the question, what essentially constitute good liturgy? Must we feel good and holy at every Eucharistic celebration? If our feelings were the criterion for judging the value of our participation many of us would receive a very low grade indeed. Furthermore we are not always in control of our feelings. We cannot switch them on and off when we want to feel good.

Fortunately there is something deeper than feelings that gives value to our workshop. What is this something deeper? It is an unshakable love of God, the constant desire to please him, serve him and worship him no matter how we feel. We do not primarily come to the Eucharist in order to derive pleasure out of it for ourselves. We come to give ourselves to God no matter what it costs. We are not seeking our own pleasure but, like Jesus, both in worship and outside of worship, we always try to do what pleases the Father (In. 8, 29) rather than what pleases ourselves. The most fundamental

disposition when celebrating the Eucharist and in leading the whole Christian life is the determination to please God rather than ourselves at all times. The 4th Eucharistic prayer reminds us that Jesus gives us the Spirit so that we may no longer live for ourselves but for God. In this Jesus is an excellent model. He came not to do his own will (what pleased himself) but the will of he who sent him. Calvary emphatically reminds us of the extent to which he preferred the Father's will to his own.

When we feel bored at the Eucharist it helps us to reflect on the true nature of love. Mature love calls for a great deal of self-sacrifice. Where true love is present we are concerned with the beloved and what pleases him/her and we willingly forego our own preferences. Love at its best is not self-indulgence but self-sacrifice. Unfortunately we often misunderstand love and think of it solely in terms of a very emotional pleasurable experience. It is true that love can sometimes bring us great emotional satisfaction but it is also true that great love can be present without any feeling of love. Jesus didn't experience an emotional 'high' as he hung on the cross. Yet he manifested on Calvary the highest possible love. Here was a love willing to lay down one's life for those he loved, namely all of us. The gospel assures us that to lay down one's life for one's friends is the greatest possible love.

Hopefully those considerations can motivate us to persevere in prayer and worship even when at times our prayer may be dry and boring. But these reflections apply not just to dry, arid prayer. The same principles apply to the practice of virtue. Sometimes we practice virtue and derive a great feeling of personal fulfillment from our good works. We are, so to speak, cheerful givers. At other times, however, obeying God's will is only achieved with great emotional repugnance and nausea. We have to make a mighty effort to overcome our reluctance. But by faith and will we somehow succeed in overcoming our emotions which, perhaps, are urging us on to sin. Indeed the struggle with temptation in our lives always involves foregoing some sinful pleasure so as to stay morally upright and please God. Conquering temptation is seldom accompanied with an emotional 'high'. Indeed we are often left wondering whether we really vanquished it or not. Yet overcoming temptation so as to please God is a very high form of love. As Jesus hung on the cross he too had to overcome many temptations so as to obey his Father.

In conclusion we must say that there is definitely a place in the Christian life for the proper integration of our feelings with our prayer and practice of virtue. Nevertheless feelings are not an essential element of Christian love and very often we are called upon to serve God lovingly, without any feeling of love, as Jesus did on Calvary. 'One cannot be his disciple unless one takes up one's cross and follows him.'

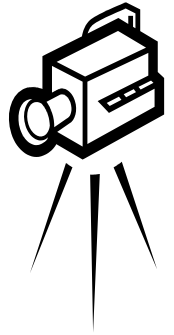
