LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES AT HOLY FAMILY

I again encourage you to plan for Lent with so many opportunities at Holy Family for your enrichment. As I mentioned last week, every morning, starting on February 26th, Deacon Mark or another leader will lead Morning Prayer at 8:10 a.m. in the Church before the 8:30 a.m. Mass. Also, each Wednesday morning and evening, one of the priests or Deacon Mark will give a short presentation on a Lenten theme. The morning presentation will be in the Church immediately after the 8:30 Mass. The evening presentation will be in the Church at 7 p.m. concluding with a special Evening Prayer.

The spirit of Lent is built on the three traditional Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and abstinence, and almsgiving. Below are brief discussions of each and a listing of some of the opportunities available at Holy Family this Lent to fulfill them.

Prayer

Prayer can take many forms, and Lent presents opportunities for several of these forms of prayer. Individually, one of the best forms of prayer is the slow and thoughtful reading of Sacred Scripture. In the Sacred Scriptures, God unfolds the history of salvation through the prophets of old and through His Son, Jesus Christ, His gospels revealing the lessons that Jesus offered to lead us to salvation. Focusing on Scripture can give us new insight into the ways in which God is speaking to us today. Study of the Catechism of the Catholic Church is also prayerful. While private prayer is crucial, prayer during Lent should also take on a public form. Catholics should make every effort to increase our participation in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation, the Stations of the Cross, Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, and, perhaps most importantly, Daily Mass.

- Morning Prayer at 8:10 a.m.
- Daily Mass at 8:30 a.m. followed by Lenten talk.
- Daily Rosary at conclusion of Lenten talk.
- Lenten Talk and Taize Prayer 7:00-8:15 p.m.
- Adoration every day until 9:00 p.m.
- Stations of the Cross Fridays at 7 p.m. followed by Lenten dinner
- Monthly Holy Hour with Youth - Fridays, 2/15/ & 3/14 - 6:30 p.m.

Fast and Abstinence

Here's a quick review of the Lenten practices of fast and abstinence:

Abstinence: As it relates to the season of Lent, to abstain is to not eat meat. The purpose of this abstinence is to be an act of penance - an act of sacrifice. Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting: To fast is to do without food. Quite simply, part of its purpose is the very experience of the effects of not eating - if you don't eat, you get hungry; when you get hungry, your body compensates with a heightened sense of awareness. So, by fasting, we clarify our thinking and our feeling, which prepares us to pray more deeply. Like abstinence, fasting also serves as penance or sacrifice. Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 years of age is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted on these two days, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

You may fast any day you'd like to help grow closer to God's will. Consider not eating out in a restaurant one night and attending Stations of the Cross on a Friday evening and joining others for the Lenten Dinner. This is a great way to increase your prayer life as well as save some money to be given to a cause of your choice.

Almsgiving

Almsgiving is helping others by sharing with them that which is ours. There are many ways to practice almsgiving - you can share love and compassion, or you can share your time and resources. The most recognized form of almsgiving is giving time, talent, and treasure to assist the poor, or to some worthy organization committed to helping the poor, the abandoned or neglected. With Lent just days away, the Annual Catholic Appeal is a perfect opportunity both for almsgiving and stewardship. Sharing our time can also be valuable - visiting and assisting the sick, the elderly and others who are homebound or in nursing homes or in the neighborhood. Keep in mind that all that we have to give belongs to God, and sharing it with others is a wonderful practice both during Lent and throughout the year.

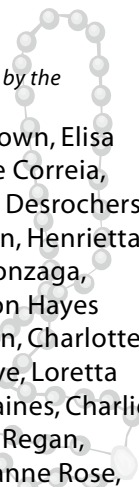
