**PASTOR APPOINTMENT PROCESS**

Many have asked who and when a new pastor will be appointed to Holy Family parish and presume I know who it is or may be. I do not know and it is the policy of the diocese that outgoing pastors have no say in their successor as you can see the problems that would create long-term. Indeed as of this date not even Bishop Soto could know as a process must be followed something like as follows:

Most likely in March, two or three priests from the Personnel Board will come to Holy Family to hold a consultation with any interested parishioners. The meeting will look at the needs of the parish and the hopes our good people have for the future. The priests conducting the meeting will not be soliciting names and in fact will make it clear that no names be mentioned as to a future pastor. The meeting is open to all parishioners and a report is made to the Bishop and the Personnel Board when they meet after the parish consultation.

The Personnel Board members are elected by the priests and a couple are appointed by the Bishop. They are objective in their discussions with the Bishop considering all aspects of the situation. At this time there are a number of retirements so many vacancies exist throughout the diocese for pastors. All the other vacancies, plus who is available for a move, qualifications, experience and much more is considered. It must be remembered that we do not have an abundance of priests and also a great many are not in the pool due to age, location choices, their health or personal reasons or have

recently been appointed so they can't be just yanked out even if they were considered good for a parish. All this is given weight by the Personnel Board and Bishop Soto who will then make the final decision.

As to a time frame, Bishop Soto will make all appointments with a July 1st, 2009 effective date. Most likely it will be at least April before an announcement is made for who will lead Holy Family, and it could be even be the end of May. It almost has to be no later than late May as with the appointment date July 1, whoever comes needs a month to get ready to move.

I hope this is helpful as I realize people are anxious to know. Whoever comes to Holy Family will be blessed by your love, respect and the way you help your priests greatly. It is understandably important to you who will serve Holy Family. Please pray that our dear Bishop will be led by the Holy Spirit in making the best choice for the good of all.

**Related Matter**

I told you before Christmas after we repainted the Church that more work would be done in the Sanctuary area in the Spring. However, now that I will be leaving July 1st, it seems best that I leave this and all except essential decisions to the new leader of the parish. It may be that a different, perhaps wider vision than mine would come forward and I do not want to tie the hands of my successor. However, on all essential matters I will be fully responsible until June 30, 2009.

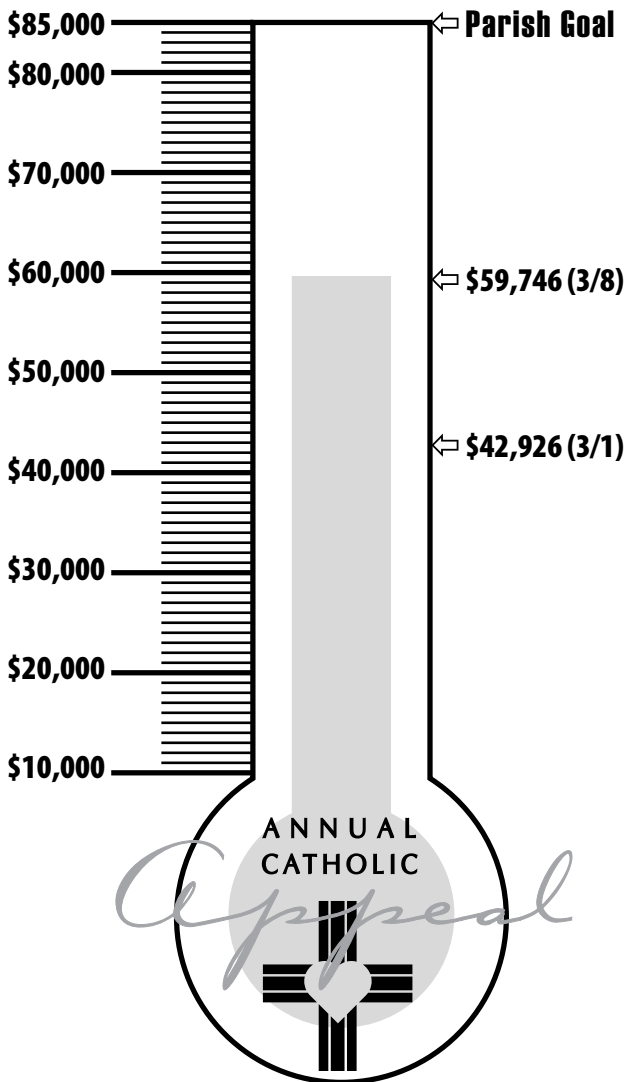

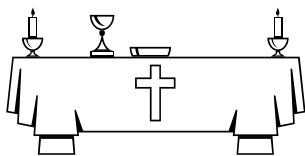
