Catholic Dioceses in California to Offer Special Masses In Support of Crime Victims' Week

Beginning this Sunday, Catholic dioceses in California will observe National Crime Victims' Week, an annual event established in 1981 to draw attention to the people and families whose lives have been affected by violent crime, by offering special Masses for victims of crime. Crime Victims' Week begins this year on Sunday, April 26.

"The effects of crime can linger long after a person's physical wounds have healed," said the Most Rev. Richard Garcia, bishop of Monterey and co-chair of the Restorative Justice Committee of the California Catholic Conference (CCC). "The people and families affected need to know that they're not alone, and that they can turn to their Church and to their community for the help and support they need."

"The Committee has two goals," said the Most Rev. Gabino Zavala, auxiliary bishop of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and co-chair of the Restorative Justice Committee, "to help victims and their families heal from the traumatic effects of violent crime and to break the cycle of crime by helping offenders rehabilitate and reintegrate with their families and communities."

Each diocesan Office of Restorative Justice provides healing and support for anyone who is affected by the criminal justice system. It focuses first on the victim and the community harmed by the crime, but then insists that the criminal offenders come to grips with the consequences of their actions.

"The concept of Restorative Justice reflects our values and tradition," said Bishop Garcia. "Our faith calls us to hold people accountable, but also to forgive and to heal. We encourage and stand with the victims of crime, their families and those who assist them."

The California Catholic Conference (www.cacatholic.org) represents the Catholic community in the State's public policy arena. There are 10 million Catholics in California and the Catholic Church is the largest private provider of health care, social services and education in California. Those Catholic institutions include 54 hospitals, which annually assist 5 million patients; 13 colleges and universities, which enroll 37,000 students; 113 Catholic high schools, which serve 75,000 students; 599 Catholic elementary schools, which enroll 182,000 children; and the 12 diocesan Catholic Charities agencies.

Catholic Climate Covenant

Last week, all U.S. parishes and elementary schools were mailed a packet of information from the Catholic Coalition on Climate Change about the Catholic Climate Covenant initiative. The kit contains a letter from Bishop Skylstad, the honorary chairman of the initiative and the St. Francis Pledge to Care for Creation and the Poor.

The Catholic Climate Covenant is an ambitious project which supports the U.S. Bishops' environmental justice program and a growing desire by the Catholic community to respond, in faith, to climate change. Sponsored by 25 national Catholic organizations, the Covenant demonstrates a Catholic commitment to care for God's creation and to stand with the poor and vulnerable who are facing the impact of a changing climate.

Bishop Soto encourages each parish to study the materials from the Catholic Coalition on Climate Change and to prayerfully consider signing the St. Francis Pledge to Care for Creation and the Poor as are parishes and dioceses all over the country.

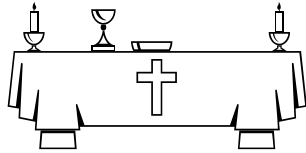

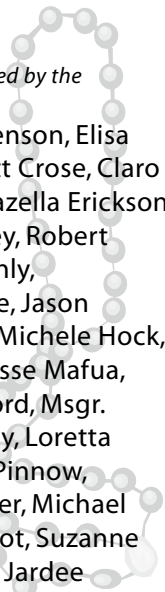

The following items are in effect **immediately** and are **now being enforced**, so they merit immediate attention from Holy Family parishioners and school families:



- **No U turn at Kadota Street** (U turns are not permitted in a business zone within 200 yards of intersecting roads)
- **No parking on roadway** (Parking is not permitted on the street in front of the church and school)

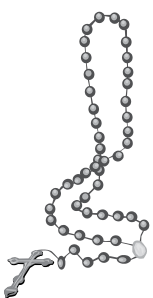


PRO-LIFE MASS FIRST FRIDAY MAY 1ST
