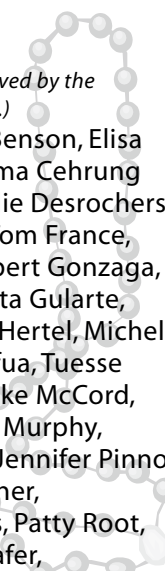

Summer 2009 Session Begins THIS WEEK.

Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find non-practicing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these loved ones however we don't know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our non-practicing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Secondly, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the catholic Church. Most non-practicing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many non-practicing Catholics carry a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church so they are afraid to approach the church for fear of being rejected. YOU can make a tremendous difference in someone's life simply by reaching out to them and telling them that we miss them and would like them to come back home to our church family.

Here at Holy Family we have a special program to help non-practicing Catholics return to the church called Catholics Returning Home. WHAT IS CATHOLICS COME HOME?

Catholics Come Home ("CCH") is an independent non-profit charity that launched a website in English: <http://CatholicsComeHome.org> and in Spanish: <http://CatolicosRegresen.org> at the beginning of Lent 2008. CCH provides dioceses with pre-packaged commercials in English and Spanish to air on Prime Time Television that point viewers to its website.



THE NEED

- Approximately 1 in 10 Americans is a former Catholic.
- Up to 100,000 baptized Catholics in the U.S. drift away from Church annually.
- In the Diocese of Sacramento, the Catholic population is estimated to be 957,000. Last October, the Diocese of Sacramento's Mass count was 136,500.

Where are the other 820,500 Catholics in our diocese?

WHY TELEVISION?

- The average American watches more than 4 hours of television each day.
- In the average home, a TV is turned on for more than a third of the day - 8 hours & 14 minutes.
- Half of American homes have 3 or more TVs in their household.
- A 2006 study shows that students recall 2 minute commercials better than full news stories.

THE BENCHMARK / TEST-MARKET - PHOENIX, ARIZONA (LENT 2008)

Demographics of Audience that Responded:

- As of April 2009, 80,000 to 92,000 inactive Catholics have returned home!
 - » ~90% become active once again without going through a parish program
 - » ~10% sought out a parish program (e.g. Catholics Returning Home or ReMembering Church), had difficulties with a particular doctrine, or required an annulment
- Many non-Catholics sought inquiry sessions through the parish R.C.I.A. process.
- Active Catholics adopted a new enthusiasm for being Catholic and for sharing their faith.

IN THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

- We will run the CCH TV Ads between Dec. 18, 2009 and Jan. 31, 2010 - 6 weeks total.
 - » 1/3 of the ads will be 2-minutes long, 1/3 will be 1-minute, 1/3 will be 30-seconds
 - » Ads will air on Prime Time TV when the most viewers are watching the most popular programs: e.g. Desperate Housewives, Monday Night Football.

HELP YOUR FELLOW CATHOLICS COME HOME

- 1) **Hospitality:** Be ready to receive those who may come home. To greet them, welcome them, and by your example model for them what it means to have a relationship with Christ and His Church.
- 2) **Evangelization:** The dismissal from Mass illustrates the important role of the community to go forth "to love and serve the Lord". This love and service is demonstrated by our willingness to proclaim the Good News and witness to it with our lives. We are called to "bring Jesus into every situation"; we have the unique ability to bring our faith and love for Christ to the workplace, the home, the mall, etc.
- 3) **Invitation:** The average active Catholic knows 2 to 3 inactive Catholics. It is so important that each and every parishioner ask our family and friends to come home.
- 4) **Catechesis:** Many Catholics don't know the teachings of the Church, even less know the scriptures of which all teaching is connected to. We should be ready to answer the basic questions about Mass, Confession, Scripture and Tradition, Marriage and Family Life, etc.
- 5) **Prayer:** All the collective efforts of the community must be offered up in prayer. We are encouraged to pray specifically those who have left the Church, those who may have been hurt by the Church, and those who are returning home.
