WELCOME FATHER POL GUMAPO

This week Holy Family Parish welcomed our new Parochial Administrator, Reverend Father Polycarpo (Pol) R. Gumapo who has been appointed by Bishop Soto to be our new shepherd, succeeding Fr. Michael Kiernan. We are truly blessed to welcome Fr. Pol into the family!

Fr. Pol was born January 26, 1942, in Medina, Misamis Oriental Mindanao, Philippines, the youngest of eight children.

He answered God's call and was ordained by Pope Paul VI on November 28, 1970, at Luneta Park, Manila, Philippines. He served the Archdiocese of Cagayan De Oro City, Philippines, for 13 years.

In April 1983, Fr. Pol came to the Diocese of Sacramento. He was the first Filipino priest to serve in our Diocese and has become role model, mentor and inspiration for the great number of Filipino priests who have truly blessed our diocese by following him to Northern California. A gifted singer, Fr. Pol formed a touring performance group "Priests Evangelizing Through Song" in 2005 partly as a support group for Filipino priests new to the diocese adjusting to life in a new country.

In his first assignment in the diocese, he served 3 months at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. For five years, from 1983 to 1988, Fr. Pol served as Parochial Vicar at Saint Vincent Ferrer Parish in Vallejo, followed by five years as Parochial Vicar at Saint Anne Parish, Meadowview, South Sacramento from 1988 to 1993. He served as Parochial Vicar at Saint Rose/Saint Patrick in South Sacramento for one year from 1993 to 1994.

In 1994, Fr. Pol became the Pastor at All Hollows Parish in Sacramento where he served for eight years from 1994 to 2002.

In 2002 Fr. Pol arrived at St. Joseph Parish in Lincoln charged by Bishop Weigand with a clear and huge task. Fr. Pol recalls the bishop's words: "He said to me, 'I want you to go to Lincoln and build a church.'" The beautiful, new St. Joseph Church was dedicated on March 18, 2007, with a Mass celebrated by Bishop Weigand.

Fr. Pol now comes to serve our beloved Holy Family Parish. He celebrated his first Mass on Thursday morning, July 2, jumping right into the action.

God Bless Fr. Pol in his new home and new ministry.

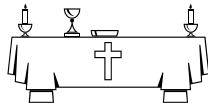

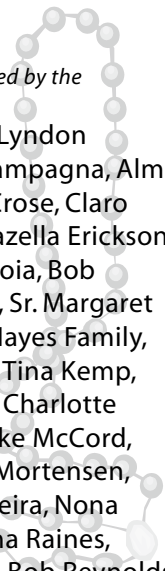

Summer 2009 Session Continues This Week

Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find non-practicing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these loved ones however we don't know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our non-practicing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Secondly, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the catholic Church. Most non-practicing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many non-practicing Catholics carry a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church so they are afraid to approach the church for fear of being rejected. YOU can make a tremendous difference in someone's life simply by reaching out to them and telling them that we miss them and would like them to come back home to our church family.

Here at Holy Family we have a special program to help non-practicing Catholics return to the church called Catholics Returning Home. The series continues this Thursday, July 9th from 7:15 to 8:45 pm. WHAT IS CATHOLICS COME HOME?

Catholics Come Home ("CCH") is an independent non-profit charity that launched a website in English: <http://CatholicsComeHome.org> and in Spanish: <http://CatolicosRegresen.org> at the beginning of Lent 2008. CCH provides dioceses with pre-packaged commercials in English and Spanish to air on Prime Time Television that point viewers to its website.

IN THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

- We will run the CCH TV Ads between Dec. 18, 2009 and Jan. 31, 2010 - 6 weeks total.
 - » 1/3 of the ads will be 2-minutes long, 1/3 will be 1-minute, 1/3 will be 30-seconds
 - » Ads will air on Prime Time TV when the most viewers are watching the most popular programs: e.g. Desperate Housewives, Monday Night Football.

HELP YOUR FELLOW CATHOLICS COME HOME

- 1) **Hospitality:** Be ready to receive those who may come home. To greet them, welcome them, and by your example model for them what it means to have a relationship with Christ and His Church.
- 2) **Evangelization:** The dismissal from Mass illustrates the important role of the community to go forth "to love and serve the Lord". This love and service is demonstrated by our willingness to proclaim the Good News and witness to it with our lives. We are called to "bring Jesus into every situation"; we have the unique ability to bring our faith and love for Christ to the workplace, the home, the mall, etc.
- 3) **Invitation:** The average active Catholic knows 2 to 3 inactive Catholics. It is so important that each and every parishioner ask our family and friends to come home.
- 4) **Catechesis:** Many Catholics don't know the teachings of the Church, even less know the scriptures of which all teaching is connected to. We should be ready to answer the basic questions about Mass, Confession, Scripture and Tradition, Marriage and Family Life, etc.
- 5) **Prayer:** All the collective efforts of the community must be offered up in prayer. We are encouraged to pray specifically those who have left the Church, those who may have been hurt by the Church, and those who are returning home.
