## **ACCEPTING THE CHALLENGE**

It may seem strange in the middle of the summer to reflect on a season many months away - the season of Lent. And yet, it strikes me that the readings today invite us to enter into a spirit that is so much a part of Lent. We are invited to enter into a spirit of reflection and openness to a process God has called us to be engaged in. This process of death and resurrection is one Jesus experienced himself. The challenge of these readings is to understand the work of Christianity. The second reading introduces a very challenging phrase. Paul says to the Ephesians, "I hope you are engaged in the work. I hope the preaching you are receiving is the preaching of Jesus."

As I grow in my understanding of Christ, I recognize that he calls us to a process that is difficult and challenging, and at times, even wrenching. Sometimes we say or think, "Oh, I hope he didn't mean that. Surely, he doesn't expect that." In many ways, religion is oversimplified. We make it less than it really is- less challenging, less transforming, and even, perhaps, less exciting. Paul's challenge to us in the reading to the Ephesians is this: "Let's make sure we are in touch with the Christ who is. Let's make sure we are open to his message." The surest way to do that is to return over and over again to the Scriptures. We need to dwell with them in order to figure out what they are saying. When we really listen to Christ, we will not just get a simple affirmation of what we thought. Rather, we look at what we are being asked to do and realize we are being challenged to take on a different way of seeing. When we reach the heart of the message, we see that it turns everything upside down. The message is revolutionary. It is transforming in the sense that it changes everything. That's why Paul says that when we open ourselves to Jesus' teaching, we will have to put on a whole new self. The "old self," leading to deterioration through illusion and desire, has got to give way to a brand-new spiritual way of thinking.

Some people misunderstand the teaching of Jesus and think, "Okay, we got the ten commandments many years ago, and we better follow them or we'll be in deeper trouble than we ever thought." The law is everything. Some people think that is the teaching of Jesus, and yet, he came to free us from slavery to the law. That doesn't mean we're given permission to break the law in any way, shape or form. But he's putting us in touch with something bigger than the law. He's inviting us into a way of life that isn't simply looking out for what we are told to do and then forcing ourselves to do it. We are looking toward a life where we are so infused with the Spirit that our will begins to become like his will. The desires and longings within us don't have to be tempered by the law; they are in the same spirit of the law. We don't need to be told to

be good - we are good. We don't need to be forced to tell the truth - we want to tell the truth. No one has to demand that we keep our promises because we long to keep them ourselves. That's what it means to be freed from the law. The law is no longer a burden held against an unruly spirit. The law is simply there to remind us of the wisdom now found deep within us.

Religion is so much more than being told we have to follow a law. It invites us to a transforming process. When Paul says that Jesus came to free us from a way of life rooted in desire, I think he is talking about a disposition that can be described in this way: We love to think of Christ as a great source of power. We go to that source of power and say, "Now, Jesus, would you help get me that power so I can obtain what I desire? Would you help me get what I long for?" This "life of desire" is one in which we seek to use God's power to accomplish what we would like to accomplish. "Make me this," or "Get this to happen." Even, "Don't let that happen." It's a way of living that doesn't involve submitting to what is but attempts to create what we think ought to be. That's the core desire we need to be freed from. Sometimes religion fills people with the idea that their role is to fix the world and everybody around them. When it turns out not to be that way, they become angry, bitter, and filled with blame for those who are part of the process making the world what it is not supposed to be. Or they simply despair that there is no God, that no one is in charge. They walk away. The preaching of Jesus doesn't call us to a disposition where we think we have great power to achieve the things we think ought to be. There's a new power giving us a strange, mysterious capacity to submit to things as they are. That doesn't mean we become defeatist and decide we won't work to make the world the best it can be. It simply means that when we come up against those things that aren't what we would like them to be and that are out of our control, we embrace them. We work through them. We believe that in them there is something really good and important.

The challenge is to really listen to the message of Jesus. We are to trust in what he is saying. He asks us to look at life very differently. If life is about comfort and organization, if we think Jesus was going to establish this in the kingdom, then we've missed the point. We must come to a new way of understanding. When we are open and really understand Jesus, we move toward a new place where our hunger is always fed and our thirst is always quenched.

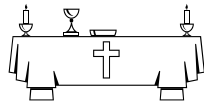
