### IN LOVING MEMORY – MONSIGNOR VITO MISTRETTA

*This week we celebrate this life and the beginning of the new life of our beloved founder and 40-year pastor, Monsignor Vito Mistretta.*

*Born January 27, 1917 in Brooklyn, New York, Msgr. Mistretta went home to his Heavenly Father on Tuesday, October 13, 2009. Father Vito Mistretta entered the priesthood on March 21, 1942, in Sacramento.*

*In 1949, Fr. Mistretta, then an assistant at St. Rose in Roseville, arranged the purchase of the abandoned army chapel from Camp Kohler near McClellan Air Force Base in North Highlands and had it moved to a three-acre olive grove in Citrus Heights that we now call our spiritual home.*

*On June 5, 1949, Pentecost Sunday, the army chapel was dedicated as Holy Family Church by Bishop Robert Armstrong. For four months, Holy Family was a mission of St. Rose Church in Roseville, after which the bishop made it a parish under founding Pastor, Father Mistretta.*

*Responding to the needs of our growing Citrus Heights community, Fr. Mistretta began the building of Holy Family School. The Sisters of Charity of the Infant Mary, from Argentina, established a North American foundation in 1959, and joined Holy Family as grade school teachers.*

*By the early 1960s, Fr. Mistretta recognized that the old chapel was becoming too small for the growing number of parishioners and began working toward the vision he shared with his flock to build a new church. Ground was broken, and on June 7, 1965, Bishop Alden Bell dedicated the new church.*

*The old army chapel was moved behind the parking lot to serve as a social hall and is now our Fine Arts Center. Fr. Mistretta had a chapel added where the Blessed Sacrament is exposed daily for adoration.*

*After forty years as our pastor, Msgr. Mistretta retired February 1, 1990, since which time he has remained Pastor Emeritus of Holy Family Parish.*

*We will celebrate a Vigil Service Sunday evening, October 18 at 7:30 pm and the Mass of Christian Burial will be celebrated by Bishop Soto on Monday, October 19 at 11:00 am in Holy Family Church.*

*As we reflect on the enormous impact Msgr. Vito Mistretta has had on our lives, whether through personal contact or through the community he built for us, consider these words that were first written for a priest who died in the tragedy of 9/11 and are now so appropriate:*

*"And so, we come to bury his body but not his spirit. We come to bury his mind but not his dreams. We come to bury his voice but not his message. We come to bury his hands but not his good works. We come to bury his heart but not his love – never his love.*

*We his family, friends and those who loved him should return the favor that he so often did for us. We have felt his big hands at a blessing. Right now, it would be so appropriate if we call on what the liturgy tells us we are, a royal priesthood and a holy nation, and we give him a blessing as he returns to the Father."*

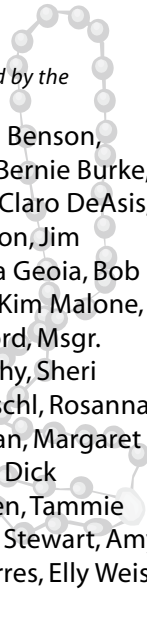

### **EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION IN THE CHAPEL:**

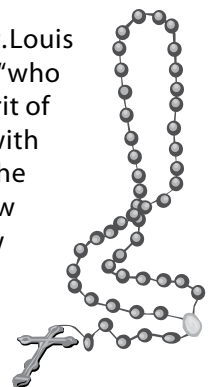
