## STEWARDSHIP COMMITMENT SUNDAY

During the last month, we have discussed and learned about Christian Stewardship and how it is a way of living — impacting all of us individually, in our families and in our parish. Christian stewardship begins with a sense of who we are as Christians — as disciples of our Lord Jesus. A good steward recognizes that all blessings come from the Lord and these blessings are to be used to serve all of creation.

This concept of Stewardship as a way of living focuses not on our temporal (temporary) needs such as facilities and debt; rather, it focuses on our spiritual “need to give.” This need lies within all our hearts. Our loving God created us in His image with the potential — and expectation — that we share our gifts with the world around us.

Stewardship is a way of living.

It is a lifestyle, a life of total accountability and responsibility. It is the acknowledging of God as the Creator and the Owner of all. Christian Stewards see themselves as the caretakers of all God's gifts. Gratitude for these many gifts is expressed in our prayer, worship, offerings and action. Stewardship is a way of thanking God for all our blessings by returning to God a portion of the many gifts (everything we have — our time, talent, and treasure) that we have been given.

As God's faithful servants, we are called to Stewardship as a way of living by:

- Prayerfully discerning how God has uniquely gifted each one of us
- Reflecting on what priority God and His Church play in our lives
- Deciding how we plan to share these gifts with God and His Church
- Making an intentional, planned and proportionate gift in the areas of time in prayer, talent and treasure.

In the bulletin last weekend you were presented with a Stewardship Commitment Form, and additional copies are available today. Hopefully you have been able to take some time to reflect on the gifts God has provided you and determine how you plan to share these gifts to serve others through our parish. Your gifts will make it possible to continue and expand the spiritual, sacramental, social and outreach ministries at our parish. At Mass today, we are all asked to return the personal stewardship commitments we intend to share with God and His Church.

Thank you for your gift of yourself. You are the Church and together we will build up God's kingdom on earth and answer His call to Stewardship as a way of living. May God bless you for sharing your gifts in service to His Church.

## **CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT COLLECTION FOCUSES ON AIDING STRUGGLING FAMILIES**

"Families are Struggling, Faith is Calling" is the theme of the 2009 collection for the Campaign for Human Development, which will be held in parishes in the Diocese of Sacramento during liturgies on the weekend of Nov. 21-22.

Since 1970, CCHD has funded community groups that create affordable housing, obtain fair wages and provide job training, as well as other organizing projects led by low-income individuals to help people and resolve their problems in their communities. CCHD's primary source of support is the annual collection held in U.S. parishes. Twenty-five percent of the proceeds support projects in the diocese where the funds are collected. Three organizations in the Diocese of Sacramento received funding from the 2008 collection: Sacramento Area Congregations Together, Placer People of Faith Together and North Valley Sponsoring Committee.

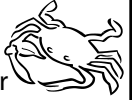
